<u>Fireworks</u> – a commercial property owner has been approached by a fireworks sale company to put a tent up to sell fireworks in Cresco. By state law, we need to allow this to be done. The proposed ordinance will still make it illegal to discharge fireworks within City limits. Sales are limited to June 13- July 8th for temporary vendors. Permanent structures can sell fireworks from June 1 – July 8 and Dec10 – Jan 3 as set by Iowa Code.

<u>Vernon Road Project</u> – Nick Rissman is proposing to the City to include the rural portion of Vernon Road (from the city limits to just before the first house) in the County's concrete replacement project. Since this portion is ag land, any assessments would be deferred anyways so we would not do this as an assessment project. We would have enough in the LOST and/or Street Funds to pay for this without borrowing.

Chickens – We had a resident request the Council amend the current Cresco Code of Ordinance that makes it illegal to have livestock (see definition) in city limits to allow egg laying hens in city limits. Council reviewed a proposed ordinance amendment but delayed action until they researched the proposal further and a Facebook survey could be conducted. The Facebook survey received 742 votes with 631 (85%) voting yes they were in favor of allowing 4 laying hens (note: not all votes were from residents of Cresco). Comments received on Facebook are enclosed. Please read the proposed ordinance 478 for all of the requirements that would need to be met by the applicant for a permit to be issued. We would also need to amend chapter 55 to make the exception to disallowing livestock for the chickens (See Ordinance #477). If Council decides to allow chickens then we will need to set public hearings for these two ordinances.

<u>Raises</u> – Personnel Committee recommends following the Union Contract for full-time employees (Except Library whose rates are set by the Library Board) to be a 3% raise on 7/1/19. They also recommend 2% for the four permanent part-time employees (note: the Boards set the part-time rates for the Theatre, Park, Fitness Center & Library).

<u>Credit Limit</u> – We have maxed out the credit card a few times. It is used for Water, Street, Sewer, Fire, City Hall, and Public Works Director. We keep it locked up and is checked out by the employee using it who then needs to provide us with invoices for any charges that are approved by the Dept Head and City Clerk. In order to increase the limit, we need to have a resolution authorizing Rod to increase it.

<u>The Pub</u> – the pub had its second violation for selling tobacco to a minor so therefore has chosen a 30-day suspension instead of paying a \$1,500 fine. The Council must approve the suspension and set the dates. I was thinking starting Monday June 10, 2019 through July 9, 2019 so that I have time to inform the Pub and the State.

Sidewalks – Daren from WHKS is recommending eliminating crosswalks on North Elm for all crossings except the intersections of 1st Ave, 2nd Ave and 3rd Ave. He is suggesting we remove the crosswalk from McGuire's corner & move it to the corner of Leutholds and mid-block of the courthouse sidewalk. This will make it easier to do the ped ramp in compliance with ADA. He is working on getting estimates for the half block from Leutholds to O'Henrys for removal of the colored concrete for the crosswalk and replacing it with regular concrete, replacing curb & gutter, and putting in one ADA compliant ped ramp at Leutholds corner. This does cause a problem by removing the crosswalk at McGuires we either have to put in a curb and replace the sidewalk behind it to remove the slanted ramp OR leave the ramp and just replace the concrete to the gutter. Problem is either way we will need to tear out the new concrete whenever we replace the crosswalk & ped ramp going north/south at that corner. It is hard to have a stopping point as each item adjoins another ped ramp or sidewalk.

Mayor Bohle called the Cresco City Council meeting to order on May 20, 2019, at 7:00 pm at City Hall. Council Members Brenno, McCarville, Fortune, Bouska and Carman were present. No council members were absent.

Bouska made the motion to approve the consent agenda which included approval of the: agenda; claims; minutes of the May 6, 2019 meeting; permit for supervised display of fireworks for Upper Iowa Speedway on July 4, 2019 at the Howard County Fairgrounds; Class E Liquor License (LE), Class B Wine Permit and Class C Beer Permit (carryout beer) to Fareway Stores Inc. d/b/a Fareway Stores Inc. #815; Class E Liquor License (LE) to Fareway Stores Inc. d/b/a Fareway Stores Inc. #815 (change of ownership effective 6/21/19); Class C Liquor License (LC) (Commercial) to Howard County Agricultural Society d/b/a Mighty Howard County Fair – Howard County Expo (change of ownership effective 1/1/19); Class C Liquor License (LC) (Commercial) to Howard County Agricultural Society d/b/a Mighty Howard County Fair – Howard County Expo (change of ownership effective 1/1/20); Class C Beer Permit (BC) to DOLGENCORP, LLC d/b/a Dollar General Store #2400 (change of ownership effective 3/1/20); Pay Request #3 for \$210,104.85 to Croell Inc. for the 2nd Street East Reconstruction Project; Pay Request #7 (Final) for \$29,129.21 to Mehmert Tiling for the Downtown Alley Project. Carman seconded and it passed all ayes.

Public Works Director Freidhof reported: (a) planting boulevard trees this week; (b) all of the sludge has been hauled out; (c) 99 fire hydrants have been painted; (d) 2nd Street Project is progressing well. Hopefully it will get opened up for cross traffic but will remain closed to finish up some items. The elevation problems have been corrected on the north end.

City Clerk Girolamo reported: (a) Sheriff Miner invited everyone to a ribbon cutting and grand opening of the Howard County Sheriff's Office and Jail on Friday May 24th at 2 pm; (b) Upper Explorerland is working on the Housing Rehab project. Two houses have been inspected and waiting for radon results and then will be bid out. Four more houses are ready to be inspected.

McCarville reported the Airport Commission had Ron Garber from Kirkham Michel attend their meeting to come up with estimates on costs to build new hangars. A work session with Council may be planned after they get more information.

Library Director Kay reported three carpet cleaning quotes have been received and they are being reviewed. The fence project has turned out really good and will do a little landscaping as well. The concrete work done by Bob Tupy appears to be working well at keeping water out of the Library. There is another area of concrete to look at on the north side.

Brenno reported the Park Board will have a public meeting with Council at 5:30 pm on May 21st at NICC to review a potential expansion project.

Mayor Bohle opened the public hearing on the proposal to convey real property to Wemark Luxury Rentals, LLC (2019 Agreement). There were no written or oral comments and the public hearing was closed. Carman made the motion to approve the Resolution Approving and Authorizing the Conveyance of Real Property to Wemark Luxury Rentals, LLC (2019 Agreement). Bouska seconded and it passed all ayes.

Five quotes were received for the Library Alley Concrete Project: Scholbrock Masonry \$10,455; Midwest Concrete \$12,400; L&S Masonry \$15,700; Ollendieck Construction \$11,744; Mudslingers Construction \$10,990. McCarville made the motion to accept the low quote \$10,455 from Scholbrock Masonry and award the contract. Work will begin after July 1, 2019 and be completed by October 1, 2019. Fortune seconded and it passed all ayes.

Bouska made the motion to approve the Resolution Accepting Work for Construction of Downtown Alley Storm Reconstruction. Carman seconded and it passed all ayes.

Mayor Bohle performed the second reading of Ordinance No. 475 pertaining to water rates. Bouska made the motion to approve the second reading of Ordinance No. 475. Carman seconded and it passed all ayes.

Mayor Bohle performed the second reading of Ordinance No. 476 pertaining to sewer service charges. Carman made the motion to approve the second reading of Ordinance No. 476. Brenno seconded and it passed all ayes.

Bouska made the motion to approve a Resolution Establishing a Fund within the City's Accounts: Fund 186 – Park Tree Fund. Fortune seconded and it passed all ayes.

Carman made the motion to approve a Resolution Authorizing Transfer of Funds from the Theatre Trust Fund to Repay Local Option Sales Tax Fund for Marquee. McCarville seconded and it passed all ayes.

Council discussed changing the Cresco Ordinance to allow the sale of fireworks to be in compliance with State Code. All sellers of fireworks must be licensed by the Iowa State Fire Marshal and comply with State laws. Discharging of fireworks within city limits will not be allowed. Brenno made a motion to set a public hearing for June 3, 2019 for proposed Ordinance No. 479 pertaining to fireworks. Bouska seconded and it passed all ayes. Mayor Bohle performed the first reading of summary of Ordinance No. 479 pertaining to fireworks. Fortune made the motion to approve the first reading of summary Ordinance No. 479. Carman seconded and it passed all ayes.

Bouska made the motion to sell the double-wide trailer at 400 3rd St SW Lot 36 for \$1 to Horkheimer Enterprises Inc. of Hazelton, Iowa with the requirement that it be moved. Fortune seconded and it passed all ayes.

Council reviewed the proposed Request for Proposal (RFP) for Development of Real Estate Located at 400 3rd St SW. Bouska requested that a plan to control runoff be included in the proposal. McCarville made a motion to set the Issue Date for May 29, 2019 and Submission Deadline for noon on August 12, 2019 at noon. Fortune seconded and it passed all ayes. Carman made a motion to establish a Selection Committee to review the RFP's submitted and to make recommendations to Council but all proposals will be submitted to Council. Members will be Mayor Bohle, PWD Freidhof, Council Members Brenno and Fortune, and HCB&T Director Jason Passmore. Bouska seconded and it passed all ayes.

Estimated costs of replacing crosswalks, curb and gutter on North Elm were not available yet. WHKS is also working on making recommendations on where crosswalks with ADA compliant pedestrian ramps should be placed.

McCarville discussed complaints received due to sump pumps draining into the street where there is not a storm sewer intake close by. Concern was that by dumping into the yard will cause water damage and complaints among neighbors. Freidhof will review maps to determine if there are feasible options to redirecting the runoff.

Mayor asked for comments from the audience. Jason Passmore reported the Housing Study is available on the Chamber's website. A copy will be made available at City Hall.

Carman moved to adjourn at 7:51 pm. Brenno seconded and it passed all ayes. The next regular Cresco City Council meeting will be June 3, 2019 at 7:00 pm at Cresco City Hall.

Mayor Bohle called the Cresco City Council special meeting to order on May 20, 2019, at 6:00 pm at the Cresco Theatre. Council Members Brenno, McCarville, Fortune, Bouska and Carman were present. No council members were absent.

Theatre Manager Wendy Lickteig led a tour of the Theatre. They discussed the status of the front wall leak and where the water had been coming in. The seats were inspected showing the wear and discomfort. They discussed the need to replace the flooring underneath and address potential subfloor issues when seats are replaced. They also looked at the cracking in the floor near the exit door to the ramp.

The recently upgraded electrical projects were reviewed. Lickteig showed them the new PA system and discussed the benefits it adds to the building and how it has been used so far. A lengthy discussion ensued about the safety of the newer stairs from the green room to the stage. The liability and danger they present were a concern.

She pointed out many of the extensive remodeling and updates that have been made to Champlin Hall. Many of the improvements were done by the Theatre Commission (and spouses) volunteering their time to perform the work.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:35 pm. The next regular Cresco City Council meeting will be May 20, 2019 at 7:00 pm at Cresco City Hall.

ORDINANCE 479 SUMMARY

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF CRESCO, IOWA, BY AMENDING CHAPTER 41 PERTAINING TO FIREWORKS

Below is a summary of ORDINANCE 479, a full copy of said ordinance may be obtained at City Hall 130 N Park Place Cresco, IA 52136

CHAPTER 41.13 FIREWORKS

It is a misdemeanor for any person to discharge or explode firecrackers, rockets, torpedoes, Roman candles, or other fireworks designed and intended for pyrotechnic display within the city limits.

No person shall sell or offer for sale consumer grade fireworks without first securing a Retail Fireworks License through the State Fire Marshal's Office for the State of Iowa. Sales are only allowed in Commercial or Industrial Zones from June 13th (June 1st for permanent structures) through July 8th by licensed vendors.

SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

WHEN EFFECTIVE. The foregoing Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of passage and publication of this ordinance as provided by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 479

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF CRESCO, IOWA, BY AMENDING PROVISIONS PERTAINING TO FIREWORKS

BE IT ENACTED by the City Council of the City of Cresco, Iowa, as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 41, Section 13, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Cresco, Iowa, is repealed and the following adopted in lieu thereof:

- 41.13 FIREWORKS. The sale, use and exploding of fireworks within the City are subject to the following:
- 1. Definition. Consumer Fireworks shall have the same meanings as defined in Iowa Code section 727.2.
- 2. Unlawful Discharge. It is a misdemeanor for any person to discharge or explode firecrackers, rockets, torpedoes, Roman candles, or other fireworks designed and intended for pyrotechnic display within the city limits.
- 3. Exception. The city may, upon application in writing, grant a permit for the display of fireworks by a City agency, fair associations, amusement parks and other organizations or groups of individuals approved by City authorities when such fireworks display will be handled by a competent operator. No permit shall be granted hereunder unless the operator or sponsoring organization has filed with the City evidence of insurance in the following amounts:
 - A. Personal Injury.....\$250,000 per person
 - B. Property Damage......\$50,000
 - C. Total Exposure......\$1,000,000
- 4. Other Exceptions. This section does not prohibit the sale or use of blank cartridges for a show or theatre, or for signal purposes in athletic sports or by railroads or trucks for signal purposes, or by a recognized military organization. This section does not apply to any substance or composition prepared and sold for medicinal or fumigation purposes.
- 5. Sales. No person shall sell or offer for sale consumer grade fireworks without first securing a Retail Fireworks License through the State Fire Marshal's Office for the State of Iowa.
 - A. City Permit. An application must be filed with City Hall that includes:
 - 1. The location and dates for the sale of fireworks. Sales of consumer fireworks are allowed only within districts zoned as Commercial C-1 or C-2 and Industrial M-1.
 - 2. Proof of Licensing from the Office of the State Fire Marshal.
 - 3. Proof of Liability Insurance covering all aspects of consumer fireworks sales for a minimum amount per occurrence of \$1,000,000 and a minimum aggregate amount of \$2,000,000.

- 4. Sales within a permanent structure or building shall be allowed between June 1 and July 8 and from December 10 until January 3.
- 5. Approved temporary structure or stand sales shall be allowed between June 13 and July 8.

SECTION 2. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 3. WHEN EFFECTIVE. This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

727.2 Fireworks.

1

- 1. Definitions. For purposes of this section:
- a. "Consumer fireworks" includes first-class consumer fireworks and second-class consumer fireworks as those terms are defined in section 100.19, subsection 1. "Consumer fireworks" does not include novelties enumerated in chapter 3 of the American pyrotechnics association's standard 87-1 or display fireworks enumerated in chapter 4 of the American pyrotechnics association's standard 87-1.
- b. "Display fireworks" includes any explosive composition, or combination of explosive substances, or article prepared for the purpose of producing a visible or audible effect by combustion, explosion, deflagration, or detonation, and includes fireworks containing any explosive or flammable compound, or other device containing any explosive substance. "Display fireworks" does not include novelties or consumer fireworks enumerated in chapter 3 of the American pyrotechnics association's standard 87-1.
- c. "Novelties" includes all novelties enumerated in chapter 3 of the American pyrotechnics association's standard 87-1, and that comply with the labeling regulations promulgated by the United States consumer product safety commission.
 - 2. Display fireworks.
- a. A person, firm, partnership, or corporation who offers for sale, exposes for sale, sells at retail, or uses or explodes any display fireworks, commits a simple misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of not less than two hundred fifty dollars. However, a city council of a city or a county board of supervisors may, upon application in writing, grant a permit for the display of display fireworks by municipalities, fair associations, amusement parks, and other organizations or groups of individuals approved by the city or the county board of supervisors when the display fireworks will be handled by a competent operator, but no such permit shall be required for the display of display fireworks at the lowa state fairgrounds by the lowa state fair board, at incorporated county fairs, or at district fairs receiving state aid. Sales of display fireworks for such display may be made for that purpose only.
- b. (1) A person who uses or explodes display fireworks while the use of such devices is prohibited or limited by an ordinance or resolution adopted by the county or city in which the firework is used commits a simple misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of not less than two hundred fifty dollars.
- (2) A person who uses or explodes display fireworks while the use of such devices is suspended by an order of the state fire marshal commits a simple misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of not less than two hundred fifty dollars.
 - 3. Consumer fireworks and novelties.
- a. A person or a firm, partnership, or corporation may possess, use, or explode consumer fireworks in accordance with this subsection and subsection 4.
- b. A person, firm, partnership, or corporation who sells consumer fireworks to a person who is less than eighteen years of age commits a simple misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of not less than two hundred fifty dollars. A person who is less than eighteen years of age who purchases consumer fireworks commits a simple misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of not less than two hundred fifty dollars.
- c. (1) A person who uses or explodes consumer fireworks or novelties while the use of such devices is prohibited or limited by an ordinance adopted by the county or city in which the fireworks are used commits a simple misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of not less than two hundred fifty dollars.
- (2) A person who uses or explodes consumer fireworks or novelties while the use of such devices is suspended by an order of the state fire marshal commits a simple misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of not less than two hundred fifty dollars.
 - 4. Limitations
- a. A person shall not use or explode consumer fireworks on days other than June 1 through July 8 and December 10 through January 3 of each year, all dates inclusive.
- b. A person shall not use or explode consumer fireworks at times other than between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m., except that on the following dates consumer fireworks shall not be used at times other than between the hours specified:

- (1) Between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m. on July 4 and the Saturdays and Sundays immediately preceding and following July 4.
- (2) Between the hours of 9:00 a.m. on December 31 and 12:30 a.m. on the immediately following day.
- (3) Between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m. on the Saturdays and Sundays immediately preceding and following December 31.
- c. A person shall not use consumer fireworks on real property other than that person's real property or on the real property of a person who has consented to the use of consumer fireworks on that property.
- d. A person who violates this subsection commits a simple misdemeanor. A court shall not order imprisonment for violation of this subsection.
 - 5. Applicability.
- a. This section does not prohibit the sale by a resident, dealer, manufacturer, or jobber of such fireworks as are not prohibited by this section, or the sale of any kind of fireworks if they are to be shipped out of the state, or the sale or use of blank cartridges for a show or the theater, or for signal purposes in athletic sports or by railroads or trucks, for signal purposes, or by a recognized military organization.
- b. This section does not apply to any substance or composition prepared and sold for medicinal or fumigation purposes.
