THIS NOTICE IS GIVEN AT THE DIRECTION OF THE MAYOR PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 21, CODE OF IOWA AND THE LOCAL RULES OF SAID GOVERNMENTAL BODY. POSTED JULY 29, 2022.

Mayor Brenno called the Cresco City Council meeting to order on July 18, 2022, at 5:30 pm. Council Members Kriener, McConnell, Fortune, Bouska, and Carman were present. No council members were absent.

Mayor Brenno revised the agenda by moving the approval of claims from the consent agenda to the business section. Carman made the motion to approve the consent agenda which included approval of the: agenda; minutes from July 6, 2022 Council meeting; Class C Liquor License (LC) with outdoor service and Sunday service to Barbara E. Holstrom d/b/a The Pub; pay request #1 for \$86,514.26 to Mehmert Tiling, Inc for the Runway Drainage Improvements Project. McConnell seconded and it passed all ayes.

Public Works Director Widell reported: (a) Bob's Electric will be at the Sewer Plant to trench in power for the gate and the new pole. The fencing company will be here in a few weeks to finish that project; (b) the 2004 incubator in the wastewater lab quit working and will be replaced this week; (c) the EV Charging Station will be here this week; (d) the public is reminded to keep lawns mowed and that grass should be six inches or less.

Police Chief Ruroden reported: (a) the tornado siren on the big water tower is not working again so Racom is scheduled to look at it; (b) only one complaint was received regarding fireworks this year; (c) Police will be having departmental meetings and attending human trafficking training; (c) Officer Welper is preparing for academy in August.

Clerk Elton reported that Auditors were here last week and now just waiting for the State to release the Audit program changes.

Bouska reported Alliant Energy presented rate analysis webinars. The rates will increase about 7.3% for most of the City's accounts and the Fitness Center will increase 12.4%. As a comparison she noted that the City's solar rates have been increasing 3% per year compared to Alliant's 4.6% per year for the past five years.

Carman reported the Library has had 99, 89, and 235 new patrons each of the respective past three years.

Carman reported the Chamber will host the annual golf outing on August 10th. The bar side of Broken Road is now open. The Veteran's Affairs and Campsite are donating flag poles near the Steve McCarville Memorial Field sign. Family Fun Night on July 28th at Evans Park will highlight the Pickleball project and the Gaga Ball Court.

McConnell reported the Park Board met and reported that memberships are up which is good for this time of year. Summer camps were very successful and Brandon may be adding a nature camp for smaller children. The Fitness Center is promoting a fundraiser with pledge cards for the 24/7 Track/Fitness Campaign.

Fortune reported the Theatre Commission met with interested volunteers for the Friends of the Theatre. The Friends would help with fundraising efforts and live events to reduce staffing expenses. The Mlinar family toured the Theatre as they had formerly lived in the apartment above the lobby and run the Theatre. They were impressed with the improvements and donated to the Theatre.

Tim Wilson from Dixon Engineering discussed the water tower repainting project. He had attended a May meeting in which he had proposed recoating the tower. In June, they performed an adhesion test and the top of the tank failed the test. Therefore, a recoating of paint would not hold. The project would then become a much bigger project with sandblasting and remediating the lead paint. He also suggested, while the tower is empty and to avoid additional mobilization expenses, that the interior should be repainted at the same time. The estimated cost is about \$784,000 with several safety improvements as well as the painting and containment.

After this initial sandblasting, primer, and paint, it should be able to be recoated two more times which should last about 45 years. Council will need to decide when to go out for bids and to do the project probably in the next three years.

Mayor Brenno asked for comments from the audience and there were none.

A request from Amy Wemark was reviewed for a sewer adjustment for water not entering the sanitary sewer system. The water used was due to a leak in the sump pump line causing the redundant system to use fresh water to trigger the valve. The water used was then pumped into the yard and not into the sanitary sewer system. Bouska made the motion to approve a sewer credit of \$208.93. Carman seconded and it passed all ayes.

Bouska made the motion to approve the resolution approving Change Order #3 for \$5,902.64 for the Runway Drainage Improvements Project for the Cresco Municipal Airport. Carman seconded and it passed all ayes.

The claims were reviewed with discussion concerning an invoice for sludge hauling from Pladsen Custom Services. Aveka was billed by the City for the cost of the sludge hauling. Carman made the motion to approve the list of claims including the Pladsen invoice. Bouska seconded. Fortune, Carman, and Bouska voted aye. Kriener and McConnell voted nay. The motion passed by majority vote.





HAULER PERMIT

AGREEMENT made by and between the Winneshiek County Area Solid Waste Agency, hereinafter referred to as Agency, and Shimek Sanitation, hereinafter referred to as Hauler.

WHEREAS, Hauler wishes to dispose of solid waste, garbage, trash, etc. at the Winneshiek County Sanitary Landfill.

IT IS HERETOFORE AGREED:

- 1. The term of this permit shall be for a period beginning on the 1st of July, 2022, and continuing through the 30th of June, 2023.
- 2. The Agency shall accept solid waste, garbage, trash, etc. from the Hauler so long as said solid waste originates from a jurisdiction that has entered into a permanent use agreement (Participating Jurisdiction) with the Agency at a rate of \$72.00 per ton. Said rate is subject to change by Agency action. The terms of this Hauler Permit are further subject to the terms of the permanent use agreement between the Agency and the Participating Jurisdiction.
- 3. The Agency shall only accept solid waste, garbage, trash, etc. originating in jurisdictions outside those with permanent use agreements (Non-Participating Jurisdiction) at a rate of \$150.00 per ton, up to a total of 1,000 tons, and with prior approval by the Agency for a minimum period ending June 30, 2023. This period may be extended by Agency resolution. Waste originating in a Non-Participating Jurisdiction and transferred within a Participating Jurisdiction shall be governed by this paragraph and not by paragraph 2 above.
- 4. The Hauler and its drivers shall report at the gate upon delivery of every load and disclose and certify, on forms to be provided by the Agency, the origin or origins of the waste they are hauling, as well as estimates of the weights picked up at each location, city, county, etc. In the event the Agency determines the Hauler and/or its drivers have misrepresented the origin of said waste, this permit will be suspended immediately and the Hauler and driver will not be allowed to haul solid waste to the landfill.
- 5. The Hauler agrees that it shall not deposit any special or hazardous waste or friable asbestos for which either federal or state approval is required without Agency approval. In the event the Agency determines the Hauler and/or its drivers deposit said special or hazardous waste or friable asbestos without a proper Federal authorization and/or IDNR approval and permission by the Agency, their permit shall be suspended and they shall be further responsible for any and all related costs associated with the removal of said waste and cleanup of site.

- 6. The Hauler certifies that they have received and reviewed a copy of the Landfill Operating / Safety Rules and agree that they will follow the same and be subject to its enforcement/penalty provisions.
- 7. The Agency shall bill the Hauler every week, for the prior week period. Accounts not paid within twenty-eight (28) days of the billing date shall accrue interest at the rate of one and one-half per cent (1.5%) per month, thereafter. As of July 1, 2022, the minimum late fee will be \$5.00 per month. The Hauler agrees to remit all charges within sixty (60) days of the billing date. If said payment is not made within said sixty (60) day period, the Hauler shall only deposit waste on a C.O.D. basis, until they are current.
- 8. The Hauler is solely responsible for the collection and remitting of all sales tax payable to the State of Iowa.

Possible Ordinance Changes for Chapters 105 and Chapter 106 for Solid Waste Collection

Depending on the presentation from Shimek Sanitation Services, or other potential haulers, the Ordinances should be updated. I have been thinking about potential issues that may arise so I think perhaps we should discuss these.

- 1. Definition of Light Commercial vs Commercial
- 2. Rentals considered residential?
 - a. Split buildings with commercial and residential
 - b. Apartments some are residential with each being billed; some have dumpsters and are billed by Hawkeye Sanitation
- 3. If Commercial and Industrial can choose between two or more authorized haulers, how will it be tracked to make sure that every business does pay for garbage collection.
 - a. Residential & Light Commercial are required to pay for garbage if their water is on
 - b. Residential & Light Commercial must use Hawkeye Sanitation
 - c. If some businesses do not pay for garbage then will their garbage stock pile on their property, get dumped somewhere in town or in the country, get put into someone else's dumpster, or burned in the backyard?
- 4. Price increases
 - a. If customers are lost, will remaining customers have higher prices to cover operating expenses
 - b. Does the City implement a limit as to how much the rates can increase?

Reminder, any hauler must have an approved agreement with the City before they are allowed to do business in the City. We will need to produce an agreement similar to the one we have with Hawkeye Sanitation and that will need to be approved by the Council at a meeting.

PURPOSE. The purpose of the chapters in this Code of Ordinances pertaining to Solid Waste Control and Collection is to provide for the sanitary storage, collection, and disposal of solid waste and, thereby, to protect the citizens of the City from such hazards to their health, safety and welfare as may result from the uncontrolled disposal of solid waste.

DEFINITIONS. For use in these chapters the following terms are defined: 105.02

- "Collector" means any person authorized to gather solid waste from public 1. and private places.
- 2. "Discard" means to place, cause to be placed, throw, deposit, or drop. (Code of Iowa, Sec. 455B.361[2])
- "Dwelling unit" means any room or group of rooms located within a structure 3. and forming a single habitable unit with facilities that are used or are intended to be used for living, sleeping, cooking, and eating.
- "Garbage" means all solid and semisolid, putrescible animal and vegetable waste resulting from the handling, preparing, cooking, storing, serving and consuming of food or of material intended for use as food, and all offal, excluding useful industrial by-products, and includes all such substances from all public and private establishments and from all residences.

(IAC, 567-100.2)

"Landscape waste" means any vegetable or plant waste except garbage. The term includes trees, tree trimmings, branches, stumps, brush, weeds, leaves, grass, shrubbery, and yard trimmings.

(IAC, 567-20.2[455B])

- 6. "Litter" means any garbage, rubbish, trash, refuse, waste materials, or debris. (Code of Iowa, Sec. 455B.361[1])
- "Owner" means, in addition to the record titleholder, any person residing in, renting, leasing, occupying, operating or transacting business in any premises, and as between such parties the duties, responsibilities, liabilities and obligations hereinafter imposed shall be joint and several.
- "Refuse" means putrescible and non-putrescible waste, including but not limited to garbage, rubbish, ashes, incinerator residues, street cleanings, market and industrial solid waste and sewage treatment waste in dry or semisolid form.

(IAC, 567-100.2)

- "Residential premises" means a single-family dwelling and any multiplefamily dwelling.
- "Residential waste" means any refuse generated on the premises as a result of residential activities. The term includes landscape waste grown on the premises or deposited thereon by the elements, but excludes garbage, tires, trade wastes and any locally recyclable goods or plastics.

(IAC, 567-20.2[455B])

"Rubbish" means non-putrescible solid waste consisting of combustible and non-combustible waste, such as ashes, paper, cardboard, tin cans, yard clippings, wood, glass, bedding, crockery, or litter of any kind.

(IAC, 567-100.2)

"Sanitary disposal" means a method of treating solid waste so that it does not produce a hazard to the public health or safety or create a nuisance.

(IAC, 567-100.2)

"Sanitary disposal project" means all facilities and appurtenances (including all real and personal property connected with such facilities) that are acquired, purchased, constructed, reconstructed, equipped, improved, extended, maintained, or operated to facilitate the final disposition of solid waste without creating a significant hazard to the public health or safety, and which are approved by the Director of the State Department of Natural Resources.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 455B.301)

"Solid waste" means garbage, refuse, rubbish, and other similar discarded solid or semisolid materials, including but not limited to such materials resulting from industrial, commercial, agricultural, and domestic activities. Solid waste may include vehicles, as defined by Section 321.1 of the Code of Iowa. Solid waste does not include any of the following:

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 455B.301)

- Hazardous waste regulated under the Federal Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, 42 U.S.C. § 6921-6934.
- Hazardous waste as defined in Section 455B.411 of the Code of Iowa, except to the extent that rules allowing for the disposal of specific wastes have been adopted by the State Environmental Protection Commission.
- Source, special nuclear, or by-product material as defined in the C. Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended to January 1, 1979.
- Petroleum contaminated soil that has been remediated to acceptable State or Federal standards.
- SANITARY DISPOSAL REQUIRED. It is the duty of each owner to provide for the sanitary disposal of all refuse accumulating on the owner's premises before it becomes a nuisance. Any such accumulation remaining on any premises for a period of more than thirty (30) days shall be deemed a nuisance and the City may proceed to abate such nuisances in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 50 or by initiating proper action in district court.

(Code of Iowa, Ch. 657)

HEALTH AND FIRE HAZARD. It is unlawful for any person to permit to accumulate on any premises, improved or vacant, or on any public place, such quantities of solid waste that constitute a health, sanitation or fire hazard.

OPEN BURNING RESTRICTED. No person shall allow, cause or permit open burning of combustible materials where the products of combustion are emitted into the open air without passing through a chimney or stack, except that open burning is permitted in the following circumstances:

(IAC, 567-23.2[455B] and 567-100.2)

Disaster Rubbish. The open burning of rubbish, including landscape waste, for the duration of the community disaster period in cases where an officially declared emergency condition exists, provided that the burning of any structures or demolished structures is conducted in accordance with 40 CFR Section 61.145.

(IAC, 567-23.2[3a])

Trees and Tree Trimmings. The open burning of trees and tree trimmings at a 2. City-operated burning site, provided such burning is conducted in compliance with the rules established by the State Department of Natural Resources.

(IAC, 567-23,2[3b])

Flare Stacks. The open burning or flaring of waste gases, provided such open burning or flaring is conducted in compliance with applicable rules of the State Department of Natural Resources.

(IAC, 567-23.2[3c])

- Landscape Waste. No landscape waste shall be burned within the City of 4. Cresco, except in an officially declared emergency condition as described in
- Recreational Fires. Open fires for cooking, heating, recreation, and ceremonies, provided they comply with the limits for emission of visible air contaminants established by the State Department of Natural Resources and the following regulations.
 - Recreational fires shall be confined to a fire pit or fire ring. A.
 - B. Recreational fires shall not exceed 3 feet in width and fueled 12 inches in height.
 - Recreational fires shall be located at least 25 feet from any neighbor's structure or dwelling.

(Ord. 447 - Dec. 13 Supp.)

- Recreational fires shall be constantly attended and monitored by a person who shall take responsibility for the fire and shall have a garden hose connected to a water supply or other approved fire extinguishing equipment readily available.
- E. Recreational fires shall be completely extinguished by 1:00 a.m.
- Police officers or the Fire Chief shall be authorized to order any F. recreational fires to be extinguished if smoke emissions cause serious annoyance or disturbance or a disturbance of the peace.
- Only logs, sticks or twigs, and dry seasoned wood shall be burned in recreational fires. No landscape waste, garbage, refuse, paper products, treated lumber or other items shall be burned.

Training Fires. Fires set for the purpose of conducting bona fide training of public or industrial employees in firefighting methods, provided that the training fires are conducted in compliance with rules established by the State Department of Natural Resources.

(IAC, 567-23.2[3g])

Variance. Any person wishing to conduct open burning of materials not permitted herein may make application for a variance to the Director of the State Department of Natural Resources.

(IAC, 567-23.2[2])

- SEPARATION OF YARD WASTE REQUIRED. All yard waste shall be separated by the owner or occupant from all other solid waste accumulated on the premises and shall be composted on the premises, deposited at the City's yard waste disposal site, or placed in biodegradable paper bags and set out for collection not more than twelve (12) hours in advance of the regularly scheduled collection day. Tree limbs shall be cut into pieces not exceeding ten (10) feet in length. No other solid waste shall be commingled with leaves. It is illegal to accumulate landscape waste on any public street or alley or right-of-way. It is the responsibility of the abutting property owner to dispose of such waste properly. No leaves or grass clippings shall be placed on or raked onto City streets or alleys. The City crews collect yard waste from mid-April to mid-November; a schedule may be obtained at City Hall. As used in this section, "yard waste" means any debris such as grass clippings, leaves, garden waste, brush and trees. Yard waste does not include tree stumps.
 - LITTERING PROHIBITED. No person shall discard any litter onto or in any water or land, except that nothing in this section shall be construed to affect the authorized collection and discarding of such litter in or on areas or receptacles provided for such purpose. When litter is discarded from a motor vehicle, the driver of the motor vehicle shall be responsible for the act in any case where doubt exists as to which occupant of the motor vehicle actually discarded the litter.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 455B.363)

OPEN DUMPING PROHIBITED. No person shall dump or deposit or permit the dumping or depositing of any solid waste on the surface of the ground or into a body or stream of water at any place other than a sanitary disposal project approved by the Director of the State Department of Natural Resources, unless a special permit to dump or deposit solid waste on land owned or leased by such person has been obtained from the Director of the State Department of Natural Resources. However, this section does not prohibit the use of rubble at places other than a sanitary disposal project. "Rubble" means dirt, stone, brick, or similar inorganic materials used for beneficial fill, landscaping, excavation, or grading at places other than a sanitary disposal project. Rubble includes asphalt waste only as long as it is not used in contact with water or in a flood plain. For purposes of this section, rubble does not mean gypsum or gypsum wallboard, coal combustion residue, foundry sand, or industrial process wastes unless those wastes are approved by the State Department of Natural Resources.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 455B.301, Sec. 455B.307 and IAC, 567-100.2)

TOXIC AND HAZARDOUS WASTE. No person shall deposit in a solid waste container or otherwise offer for collection any toxic or hazardous waste. Such materials shall be transported and disposed of as prescribed by the Director of the State Department of Natural Resources. As used in this section, "toxic and hazardous waste" means waste materials, including (but not limited to) poisons, pesticides, herbicides, acids, caustics, pathological waste, flammable or explosive materials, and similar harmful waste that requires special handling and that must be disposed of in such a manner as to conserve the environment and protect the public health and safety.

(IAC, 567-100.2) (IAC, 567-102.13[2] and 400-27.14[2])

- 105.10 WASTE STORAGE CONTAINERS. Every person owning, managing, operating, leasing, or renting any premises, dwelling unit or any place where refuse accumulates shall provide and at all times maintain in good order and repair portable containers for refuse in accordance with the following:
 - 1. Container Specifications. Waste storage containers shall comply with the following specifications:
 - A. Residential. Residential waste containers shall be carts provided by hauler or designated collection bags. Disposable collection bags shall be securely fastened, and reusable carts shall be closed securely in order to be serviced.
 - B. Commercial. Every person owning, managing, operating, leasing or renting any commercial premises where an excessive amount of refuse accumulates and where its storage in one or two carts as required above is impractical, shall maintain bulk storage containers approved by the City and provided by the collector.
 - 2. Storage of Containers. Residential solid waste containers shall be stored upon the residential premises. Commercial solid waste containers shall be stored upon private property, unless the owner has been granted written permission from the City to use public property for such purposes. The storage site shall be well-drained and fully accessible to collection equipment, public health personnel, and fire inspection personnel. All owners of residential and commercial premises shall be responsible for proper storage of all garbage and yard waste to prevent materials from being blown or scattered around neighboring yards and streets.
 - 3. Location of Containers for Collection. Carts or collection bags for the storage of solid waste awaiting collection shall be placed at the curb or alley line by the owner or occupant of the premises served. Carts, collection bags or other solid waste placed at the curb line shall not be so placed more than twelve (12) hours in advance of the regularly scheduled collection day and shall be promptly removed from the curb line following collection.
 - 4. Nonconforming Containers. Solid waste placed in containers that are not in compliance with the provisions of this section will not be collected.

(Section 105.10 - Ord. 492 - Jan. 22 Supp.)

105.11 PROHIBITED PRACTICES. It is unlawful for any person to:

- 1. Unlawful Use of Containers. Deposit refuse in any solid waste containers not owned by such person without the written consent of the owner of such containers.
- 2. Interfere with Collectors. Interfere in any manner with solid waste collection equipment or with solid waste collectors in the lawful performance of their duties as such, whether such equipment or collectors be those of the City, or those of any other authorized waste collection service.

- 3. Incinerators. Burn rubbish or garbage except in incinerators designed for high temperature operation, in which solid, semisolid, liquid, or gaseous combustible refuse is ignited and burned efficiently, and from which the solid residues contain little or no combustible material, as acceptable to the Environmental Protection Commission.
- Scavenging. Take or collect any solid waste that has been placed out for collection on any premises, unless such person is an authorized solid waste collector.
- 5. Landscape Waste. Burn landscape waste within the City, except in an officially declared emergency condition.
- 105.12 SANITARY DISPOSAL PROJECT DESIGNATED. The sanitary landfill facilities operated by Winneshiek County are hereby designated as the official "Public Sanitary Disposal Project" for the disposal of solid waste produced or originating within the City.
- 105.13 YARD WASTE DISPOSAL SITE. A yard waste disposal site has been established by the City for use by residents of the community. The Council shall adopt by resolution the rules and regulations for the disposal site. Such rules will include the operating hours of the site, the type and size of degradable bags, the size of tree limbs and the type and size of organic debris to be deposited at the site. The Council shall also adopt by resolution the fees to be charged to the residents and nonresidents of the City for depositing yard waste at the disposal site.
- 105.14 RECYCLING PROGRAM. The City shall provide for the collection of recyclable material in accordance with the provisions of the contract between the City and the collector. All recycling shall be comingled and shall not be separated by the use of paper sacks or plastic bags or other means. All food containers must be cleaned. Recyclables shall be collected once every two weeks.

106.01 COLLECTION SERVICE. The City shall provide by contract for the collection of all solid waste except bulky rubbish as provided in Section 106.05 within the City.

COLLECTION VEHICLES. Each household will be furnished one cart for 106.02 comingled recycling and one cart for non-recyclable waste. Light commercial accounts, that do not require a dumpster, will be furnished one cart for non-recyclable waste. Property owners shall keep carts cleaned to prevent nuisances, pollution, or insect breeding, and maintained in good repair. Each cart will have a unique serial number which is assigned to the residential or light commercial account. (Ord. 492 - Jan. 22 Supp.)

LOADING. Vehicles or containers used for the collection and transportation of any solid waste shall be loaded and moved in such a manner that the contents will not fall, leak, or spill therefrom, and shall be covered to prevent blowing or loss of material. Where spillage does occur, the material shall be picked up immediately by the collector or transporter and returned to the vehicle or container and the area properly cleaned.

FREQUENCY OF COLLECTION. All solid waste shall be collected from residential premises at least once each week and from commercial, industrial and institutional premises as frequently as may be necessary, but not less than once each week.

BULKY RUBBISH. Bulky rubbish that is too large or heavy to be collected in the normal manner of other solid waste may be collected by the collector upon request in accordance with procedures therefor established by the collector.

106.06 RIGHT OF ENTRY. Solid waste collectors are hereby authorized to enter upon private property for the purpose of collecting solid waste therefrom as required by this chapter; however, solid waste collectors shall not enter dwelling units or other residential

CONTRACT REQUIREMENTS. No person shall engage in the business of collecting, transporting, processing or disposing of solid waste for the City without first entering into a contract with the City. This section does not prohibit an owner from transporting solid waste accumulating upon premises owned, occupied or used by such owner, provided such refuse is disposed of properly in an approved sanitary disposal project. Furthermore, a contract is not required for the removal, hauling, or disposal of earth and rock material from grading or excavation activities, provided that all such materials are conveyed in tight vehicles, trucks or receptacles so constructed and maintained that none of the material being transported is spilled upon any public right-of-way.

COLLECTION FEES. The collection and disposal of solid waste as provided by 106.08 this chapter are declared to be beneficial to the property served or eligible to be served and there shall be levied and collected fees therefor in accordance with the following:

Yard Waste. The fee for collection of yard waste is \$1.75 per month for each residential and commercial premises.

- 3. Commercial, Industrial and Institutional Premises. The fee for the collection of solid waste and recyclables for each commercial, industrial, and institutional premises shall be negotiated between the collector and the customer and billed by the City.
- 4. Payment of Bills. All fees are due and payable under the same terms and conditions provided for payment of a combined service account as contained in Section 92.04 of this Code of Ordinances. Solid waste collection service may be discontinued in accordance with the provisions contained in Section 92.05 if the combined service account becomes delinquent, and the provisions contained in Section 92.09 relating to lien notices shall also apply in the event of a delinquent account.

106.09 LIEN FOR NONPAYMENT. Except as provided for in Section 92.08 of this Code of Ordinances, the owner of the premises served and any lessee or tenant thereof are jointly and severally liable for fees for solid waste collection and disposal. Fees remaining unpaid and delinquent shall constitute a lien upon the premises served and shall be certified by the Clerk to the County Treasurer for collection in the same manner as property taxes.
