THIS NOTICE IS GIVEN AT THE DIRECTION OF THE MAYOR PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 21, CODE OF IOWA AND THE LOCAL RULES OF SAID GOVERNMENTAL BODY. POSTED JULY 12, 2019.

<u>Fire Station Concrete</u> – We were able to contract with Andera Construction to grind down the concrete trouble spots for about \$550 in July.

<u>Financial Statements</u> – enclosed are the yearend revenues, expenses and fund balances. I am working on more detailed reports that will show how each department ended up. Sorry, but with the Auditors here this week I did not have time to get them finished up for this meeting.

<u>Chickens</u> –regarding changing the code of ordinances to allow up to 6 chickens per household with a valid permit. The third reading of three will be performed. If the 3rd reading is approved, then the ordinance is voted on. It does not take effect until approved and published.

<u>Re-Zoning</u> – the City of Cresco is requesting the Planning & Zoning Commission to re-zone the trailer park area from R-4 to R-3. All neighboring property owners within 200 feet will receive the enclosed letter informing them of the public hearing on August 6, 2019. The City Council is invited to attend the public hearing in case there are objections against our request.

<u>P&Z Fee</u> – Council may waive the \$100 fee charged for the P&Z meeting request. Historically, we have waived the fee since it would come out of the City and be receipted back into the City.

<u>Fire Bldg</u> – The 7th pay request is included in the consent agenda and the list of claims. They are getting close to being done and waiting for some subcontractor work to get finished up. There is about \$41,500 left to pay on it including the retainage. We hope to have it finished by end of this month. There were some change orders to reduce the contract price by \$14,701. Someone asked what the total project cost was and I have it estimated at about \$575,000 including the property purchase price of \$15,000.

<u>Transfers</u> – As part of the new laws requiring more transparency in City Budgets, the Iowa League of Cities recommended that cities now do a resolution for transfers. Previously we had not done resolutions for transfers that were included in the budget since the Council already approved the transfers when approving the budget. Here is the resolution for the transfers that will be done soon and/or done monthly. We will do other resolutions for the transfers that are done in Nov & May for debt payments, and in Jan for annual transfers, and in June for the end of year transfers.

Michelle

Mayor Bohle called the Cresco City Council meeting to order on July 1, 2019, at 7:00 pm at City Hall. Council Members Brenno, McCarville, Fortune, Bouska and Carman were present. No council members were absent.

Brenno requested a change be made to the minutes regarding the phrase "three cats or two dogs" should be replaced with "a combined total of three cats and dogs". Bouska made the motion to approve the consent agenda which included approval of the: agenda; claims; minutes of the June 17, 2019 meeting; Partial Street Closing Permit for North Elm Street from 1st Ave to 3rd Ave (Parking Spaces Only – Street Remains Open) for Ridiculous Day on July 18, 2019; Tax Abatements under the Urban Revitalization Plan for Peddler Real Estate and for Andrew & Natasha Ludeking. Brenno seconded and it passed all ayes.

Public Works Director Freidhof reported: (a) the Street Department is very busy with the storms and tree damage with at least 28 addresses that had issues; (b) the Sewer Department is busy with issues at the lift stations due to the heavy rains; (c) an employee from Decorah has contacted us to figure out what to do with problems of sump pumps that run all year round and dump into the street and end up with a green slimy film. Dumping in the yard causes problems with neighbors so it is a difficult problem to deal with. We will work with Decorah to see if we can come up with a good plan for these types of issues; (d) we are on the list for an urban tree inventory to be done by the DNR Forestry. Hopefully they will do the inventory in the spring after the remaining hundred ash trees have been removed. Brenno asked again about the sump pumps that dump into Gillette and run for several blocks but is not close to any storm sewer. Freidhof commented that there are at least six other locations in town with the same issue.

The June police report was submitted to Council.

City Clerk Girolamo reported: (a) we will have a special yard waste pick up on Monday due to the storms; (b) the City was awarded two grants of \$5,000 each from the Northeast Iowa Regional Housing Trust Fund for demolition costs of the Ellison house and the trailers that were acquired through the nuisance abatement process; (c) due to the holiday weekend we will leave the American flags up until Monday; (d) Housing Rehab update is that two houses will be bid out on 7/22/19, three other houses need to be inspected, and one more is working on the admin plan; (e) the fiscal yearend was processed and we have a loss of about \$704,000 which is less than the budgeted loss of \$2.1 million. About \$476,000 was attributed to projects not finished in last fiscal year, and therefore the budget is being amended tonight for those projects. The rest of the budgeted expenses that were not spent were for other projects or equipment that were postponed and some expenses that came in under budget; (f) Auditors will be here next week.

Library Director Kay reported window cleaners are coming Thursday and carpet cleaners on July 20th and 21st.

Mayor Bohle opened the public hearing on the proposed budget amendment for FY 2019/2020. There were no oral or written comments and the public hearing was closed. Carman made the motion to approve a resolution amending the current budget for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2019. Bouska seconded and it passed all ayes.

This quarter Hotel/Motel Tax of \$3,874.95 was received with four grant requests for \$6,800. Brenno made the motion to approve the recommendation of the Cresco Tourism Advisory Committee and award grants to: Cresco Fine Arts Council \$500; Champlin Hall Renovations \$2,000; Norman Borlaug Harvest Fest \$1,000. The request from Kellow House was scored favorably but denied until an earlier project is completed and the previous grant is paid out. McCarville seconded and it passed all ayes.

Bohle performed the second reading of the summary of Ordinance No. 478 pertaining to urban chickens. Carman made the motion to approve the second reading of the summary of

Ordinance No. 478. Fortune seconded. McCarville, Carman and Fortune voted aye. Bouska and Brenno voted nay. The motion passed by majority vote.

Mayor Bohle performed the second reading of Ordinance No. 477 pertaining to livestock in City limits. Carman made the motion to approve the second reading of Ordinance No. 477. Fortune seconded. McCarville, Fortune and Carman voted aye. Brenno and Bouska voted nay. The motion passed by majority vote.

McCarville made the motion to approve a resolution authorizing the Mayor and City Clerk to enter into an easement for water main with Peddler Real Estate. Brenno seconded and it passed all ayes.

McCarville made the motion to approve the recommendation of the Planning and Zoning Commission to appoint Dick Schorr for a term of three years expiring 6/30/2022. Carman seconded and it passed all ayes.

Brenno made the motion to approve the recommendation of the Planning and Zoning Commission to reappoint Kris Omar for a term of three years expiring 6/30/2022. Fortune seconded and it passed all ayes.

Bouska made the motion to approve the recommendation of the Board of Adjustments to appoint Kevin Weinacht for a term of three years expiring 6/30/2022. Carman seconded and it passed all ayes.

The City of Cresco has been awarded a 2019 Twins Fields for Kids matching grant of \$4,000 for renovations at the Kessel Park ball diamond. The grant will be used for a new fence, removal of trees and shrubs, and a new scoreboard. We also received a \$1,000 grant from the Howard County Community Foundation for this project. Bouska made the motion to approve a resolution authorizing the Mayor and City Clerk to enter into an Agreement with the Minnesota Twins Community Fund. Carman seconded and it passed all ayes.

The concrete in front of the Cresco Fire Station is settling and there are a couple of spots that need repairs according to an Insurance Agent that was inspecting the boiler. Estimates to repair just the spots would be \$5,800 and would not address the depression issue. Estimated cost to replace all of the concrete would be about \$50,000. Council suggested we try to get a concrete contractor to grind down the lips. Major repairs would need to be addressed in the next budget.

Mayor Bohle asked for comments from the audience. Brenno inquired as to the flooding issue by H&S Motors. Engineers had looked at the issue about 4 four years ago and it was possibly about a million dollars. Brenno thinks the City has to address the issue because H&S is considering doing some driveway and parking lot repairs. Bouska suggested that the City needs to start requiring a runoff control to keep rain from getting into the storm sewer. She noted that all four corners at that intersection are hardscape. She thinks property owners must need to help with runoff control if putting in hardscape and not putting all the responsibility on the City. Brenno requested the engineer's plans and estimates be reviewed.

Brenno moved to adjourn at 7:31 pm. Bouska seconded and it passed all ayes. The next regular Cresco City Council meeting will be July 15, 2019 at 7:00 pm at Cresco City Hall.

Fortune, Carman and McCarville voted aye. Brenno and Bouska voted nay. The motion passed by majority vote.

ORDINANCE 478 SUMMARY

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF CRESCO, IOWA, BY ADDING A NEW CHAPTER PERTAINING TO URBAN CHICKENS

Below is a summary of ORDINANCE 478, a full copy of said ordinance may be obtained at City Hall 130 N Park Place Cresco, IA 52136

CHAPTER 57 URBAN CHICKENS

No more than six (6) chickens shall be kept or maintained per property at any time. Roosters are not allowed. An annual application and permit fee of \$10 is required. A fine will be imposed of \$250 for keeping chickens without a valid permit. Random inspections will be conducted to ensure applicable conditions have been met.

Chickens must be confined in a coop, fowl house, or mobile coop not less than 18 inches in height. An area of 4 to 12 square feet per chicken is required and must be a minimum of 25 feet from any property line. It must be completely enclosed and designed to prevent entry of predators. It must be well ventilated and drained and kept clean and sanitary. Slaughtering of chickens or selling of eggs is forbidden.

SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

WHEN EFFECTIVE. The foregoing Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of passage and publication of this ordinance as provided by law.

ORDINANCE 478

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF CRESCO, IOWA, BY ADDING A NEW CHAPTER PERTAINING TO URBAN CHICKENS

BE IT ENACTED by the City Council of the City of Cresco, Iowa, as follows:

SECTION 1. NEW CHAPTER. The Code of Ordinances of the City of Cresco, Iowa, is amended by adding a new Chapter 57, entitled URBAN CHICKENS, which is hereby adopted to read as follows:

CHAPTER 57 URBAN CHICKENS

- 57.01 Purpose
- 57.02 Definitions
- 57.03 Where Permitted
- 57.04 Enclosure Requirements
- 57.05 Number of Chickens Permitted
- 57.06 Permit Requirements
- **57.01 PURPOSE.** The purpose of this chapter is to protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens within the City by allowing a process by which a property owner may keep a limited number of domesticated chickens on their property while observing minimum property standards.
 - 57.02 DEFINITIONS. For use in this Chapter the following terms are defined:
- 1. "Chicken" means a member of the subspecies Gallus gallus domesticus, a domesticated fowl.
- 2. "Urban Chicken" means a chicken kept on a permitted tract of land pursuant to a permit issued under this Chapter.
- 3. "Coop" means a cage enclosure or building used for housing and protecting chickens from weather and predators.
- 4. "Pen" means an enclosure for chickens which allows freedom of movement but also prevents escape.
- 5. "Permittee" means an applicant who has been granted a permit to raise, harbor or keep chickens pursuant to this Chapter.
- 57.03 WHERE PERMITTED. Not withstanding the provisions of this section, the keeping of domestic chickens (sub species gallus gallus domesticus), except roosters, shall be permitted in single family residential properties lying within residential zoning districts as shown on the City of Cresco official Zoning Map so long as such keeping is in compliance with this subsection and all other applicable City ordinances.

- 57.04 ENCLOSURE REQUIREMENTS. The following criteria shall be considered a minimum form of compliance for the City to consider issuing a permit allowing for the presence of any particular chickens unless allowing such chickens would endanger the health, safety, peace, quiet, comfort, enjoyment of, or otherwise become a public nuisance to nearby residents or occupants or places of business:
 - A. Chickens must be confined in a coop, fowl house, or mobile coop, known as a chicken tractor, not less than 18 inches in height. In addition to be confined within a coop, a fenced pen area at a size outlined below shall be maintained. Chickens must be kept within the coop, the fowl house, or the fenced pen area at all times unless removed for a temporary time for the safety of the chicken.
 - B. The coop, the fowl house, or the fenced pen area must be of such a design to be reasonably expected to prevent entry by dogs, cats, or other animals and shall be completely enclosed.
 - C. The coop or fowl house must be used for chickens only and must be well ventilated.
 - D. The coop, the fowl house, or the fenced pen area shall have a minimum of four (4) square feet of floor area for each chicken but shall not be any larger than twelve (12) square feet of area for each chicken.
 - E. The coop, fowl house, or the fenced pen area shall be a minimum of twenty-five (25) feet from any neighboring dwelling property line at all times. In the event a zoning or other ordinance requires a greater distance, the more restrictive regulations shall apply.
 - F. Any coop, fowl house, or fenced pen area must be well drained so there is no accumulation of moisture.
 - G. Any coop, fowl house, or the fenced pen area shall be kept clean, sanitary and free from accumulation of chicken excrement and objectionable odors. All droppings and body excretions shall be either placed in fly-proof containers and double-bagged in plastic bags or, in the alternative, used as fertilizer on the same property or, with the owner's permission, on other property within the City, so long as the droppings and body excretions are spread and incorporated into the soil within twenty four (24) hours.
 - H. In addition to the coop, fowl house, or fenced pen area, the permittee shall be responsible for sufficiently confining chickens to the permitted property and prevent chickens from entering upon any adjacent property. Loose chickens may not be returned if City personnel are required to capture them.
 - I. All chicken feed shall be stored in rodent-proof containers.
 - J. All such chickens shall be hens; no roosters are permitted.

- K. The City shall not be liable for injury or death of chickens caused by dogs, cats, or other animals, domestic or wild, whether such animals are licensed by the City or not. Further, injury or death of a chicken caused by an animal is not, in and of itself, sufficient grounds for the City to determine that the animal is a vicious animal pursuant to this Code of Ordinances.
- L. Any dead chicken shall be disposed of immediately upon discovering said chicken in a manner so as to not cause a nuisance pursuant to this Code of Ordinances.
- M. Slaughtering of chickens or selling of eggs is forbidden.
- N. An owner or possessor of animals on property that is newly annexed or rezoned to a residential classification has ninety (90) days from the date of annexation or rezoning to bring the property into compliance required by this section.
- O. A violation of this subsection is a municipal infraction as provided in the Code of Ordinances.
- 57.05 NUMBER OF CHICKENS PERMITTED. No more than six (6) chickens shall be kept or maintained per property at any time. Roosters are not allowed.
- 57.06 PERMIT REQUIREMENTS. No person shall keep any chickens unless they possess a City of Cresco permit issued by the City Public Works Director or their designee. A fine of two hundred fifty (\$250) dollars will be imposed for having chickens without a valid permit.
 - A. Fee. The fee for such permit shall be ten (\$10) dollars.
 - B. Permits will be granted for one (1) year valid from January 1st through December 31st and shall not be pro-rated for partial year.
 - C. Permits may be purchased at any time during the year but will be valid only through December 31st.
 - D. Property owner shall notify the City upon discontinuance of housing chickens.
 - a. As part of discontinuing of housing chickens on the property, the pen and coop areas shall be cleaned in a timely manner so as to not provide a nuisance to neighboring property owners.
 - b. Fees shall not be refunded if the property owner removes the chickens from the premises.
 - E. The permit may be suspended or revoked by the Public Works Director, or their designee, upon hearing and finding evidence that the permittee has violated the conditions of the permit listed in this Section of the Code.

- a. All chickens must be removed from the premises and disposed of in accordance with public health practices upon revocation of the permit.
- b. There will be no refund of the permit fee.
- c. All associated costs of removal of the chickens shall be assessed back to the property owner.
- F. By the granting of the permit to raise chickens and the application thereof, the permittee authorizes that the City or its agents have the right to go onto permittee's property any time for the limited purpose of inspection of the premises to ensure that all applicable conditions have been met.

SECTION 2. REPEALER. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 4. WHEN EFFECTIVE. This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

SECTION 1. Chapter 55, Section 05, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Cresco, Iowa, is repealed and the following adopted in lieu thereof:

55.05 LIVESTOCK. It is unlawful for a person to keep livestock except chickens within the corporate limits of the City except in an area zoned for this purpose. Chickens are allowed by permit only and according to regulations in Chapter 57 of the Code of Ordinances. No roosters are allowed within corporate limits of the City.

SECTION 2. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.
