<u>Chickens</u> – public hearing to hear comments from the public regarding changing the code of ordinances to allow up to 6 chickens per household with a valid permit. If council decides to move forward with the change, the first reading of three will be performed. It is not approved until after 3 readings at public meetings.

<u>Vernon Road</u> – the public works committee met with Nick Rissman, Jeff Freidhof and Pat Murray from the County. They gave an estimate of \$205,000 for the City's cost for 1850 feet but we may do a little less. The County will be paying all of the mobilization fees, traffic control, dust control, detour costs, and anything else that they would have incurred without the City's additional work. The City will reimburse the County for the actual costs incurred above the County's direct costs. The Public Works Committee is recommending doing this rural section with the County at this time because all of the property is ag land which would be deferred in an assessment project anyways. Also they felt the County was being more than generous in the allocation of costs and we will get the worst section of the road repaired now. The drainage issues will still need to be addressed as well.

<u>CFT</u> – This agreement must be updated annually. They will come to a meeting soon to explain the expansion that they are planning to do so the council can have input on issuing a building permit.

Write-Offs – unfortunately we have 11 accounts that we are unable to collect or assess for a total of \$1,328.09. Please see attached form for the reasons and/or collection efforts that have been tried.

<u>Budget Amendment</u> – we need to do a budget amendment at the next meeting because of projects/equipment not getting done in this fiscal year.

Municipal Pipe – in January 2018 we entered into a five-year contract that locked our rates with a minimum of \$3,000 per year commitment for work done. However, there was a clause that either party could terminate the agreement with a 30 day notice. They are terminating that contract and issuing a new contract with significant increases in rates. The rate increases range from 18% to 76% on a per unit charge and also a 3% increase every June. We have discussed it with them and reviewed quotes that we looked at last December from another company. Unfortunately there are only two major companies doing this work in our area for small towns. This is still cheaper than the other company due to mobilization costs. We also asked about not contracting and just hiring as needed. It would cost us about \$2,745 more per visit (our annual work on lift stations and televising as an example). Therefore, we think it is inour best interest to enter into this contract with the knowledge we can terminate at any time with a 30 day notice if we find better prices somewhere else.

<u>Sidewalks</u> – The County is willing to work with us and will replace the sidewalk as needed on North Elm. We may look into making a handicap accessible parking spot as well. We need to discuss if we are ready to move forward with the project as discussed and contacting impacted business owners.

<u>Dying Trees</u> – As the emerald ash borer has moved in, we noticed there are many trees on private property that are starting to die. Enclosed are excerpts from our two ordinances addressing diseased and dying trees. We are looking for council input on how to proceed with addressing these problems.

Michelle

Mayor Bohle called the Cresco City Council meeting to order on June 3, 2019, at 7:00 pm at City Hall. Council Members Brenno, McCarville, Fortune, Bouska and Carman were present. No council members were absent.

Carman made the motion to approve the consent agenda which included approval of the: agenda; claims; minutes of the May 20, 2019 meeting and May 20 and 21 worksessions; permit for supervised display of fireworks for Alan Lewis on July 4, 2019 at 808 Vernon Road; Cigarette/Tobacco Permits for: Casey's Marketing dba Casey's General Store #2511; Fareway Stores Inc. dba Fareway Store #815; JAGDAMBE, LLC dba Cresco Mart; Aaron & Sheila Wemark dba The Ox & Wren Spirits and Gifts; Big Daddy Hideaway Corp. dba Hideaway Lounge; Kwik Trip, Inc. dba Kwik Star #428; James & Barb Holstrom dba The Pub; Pay Request #6 for \$98,611.90 to Cresco Building Service Inc for the City of Cresco Fire Department Storage Facility. Fortune seconded and it passed all ayes.

Public Works Director Freidhof reported: (a) seeding on 2nd Street so hopefully we can get that street opened up; (b) still working on frost boils and potholes; (c) cleaning up at the trailer park and mowing what we can; (d) getting sanitary manholes to grade which makes it easier to access when needed; (e) working on some abandoned properties under Code 657A; (f) sent 22 letters for lawn mowing violations; (g) Mike, Michelle and I are meeting with Cresco Food Technologies regarding the renewal of the treatment agreement. CFT will come to the Council to discuss their expansion so we can get some Council input before approving the building permit.

Police Chief Ruroden presented the monthly police report. Cresco Police worked with Howard County Sheriff's Department and Iowa State Patrol on a special project last week on Highway 9 that was a good joint project. May had thirteen burglaries but happy to report an adult was caught in the act and arrested.

City Clerk Girolamo reported they have been very busy especially getting ready for the meeting and ordinance changes. Department Heads are finishing their projects for end of the year.

Council Member Bouska reported she attended nuisance abatement training and unfortunately all cities are dealing with the same issues we are in regard to nuisances.

Mayor Bohle opened the public hearing on the proposed Ordinance No. 479 pertaining to fireworks. There were no written or oral comments and the public hearing was closed. Mayor Bohle performed the second reading of Ordinance No. 479. Bouska made the motion to approve the second reading of Ordinance No. 479. Carman seconded and it passed all ayes. Carman made the motion to approve the resolution waiving the 3rd reading and consideration of Ordinance No. 479. Brenno seconded and it passed all ayes. McCarville made the motion to approve Ordinance No. 479 pertaining to fireworks. Fortune seconded and it passed all ayes.

Nick Rissman, Howard County Engineer, discussed the Vernon Road Project that the County is doing. He asked the City if they wanted to consider doing the rural portion of the City's section of Vernon Road as part of the County's project. The Council was interested in possibly doing the rural section so the County will present cost estimates at the next City Council meeting. There is a drainage issue that needs to be addressed even if the road is not replaced.

Mike Gooder explained the extensive expansion that Plantpeddler is doing. This multimillion dollar project will add an additional 100,000 square feet and will create about 20 new jobs. They will be bringing some of the genetic testing to Cresco that is currently done in Holland and Canada now. He invited Council and the public to their open house at 9:00 am on Monday, June 17, 2019.

The Council revisited the request to change the City's ordinance that disallows chickens within the city limits. After a lengthy discussion of the pros and cons of allowing chickens, a few

additional items will be added to the proposed ordinance. The greatest concern is the enforcement of all the regulations required by the permit. Carman made the motion to proceed with revising the proposed draft of the ordinance by allowing up to six chickens per household, imposing a \$250 fine if a valid permit is not obtained, and a notice that loose chickens will not be returned. Fortune seconded. McCarville, Fortune and Carman voted aye. Brenno and Bouska voted nay. The motion passed by majority vote.

Fortune made the motion to set the Public Hearing for June 17, 2019 to amend Ordinance No. 477 pertaining to livestock. Carman seconded. McCarville, Fortune and Carman voted aye. Brenno and Bouska voted nay. The motion passed by majority vote.

Carman made the motion to set the Public Hearing for June 17, 2019 to amend Ordinance No. 478 adding a chapter pertaining to urban chickens. Fortune seconded. McCarville, Fortune and Carman voted aye. Brenno and Bouska voted nay. The motion passed by majority vote.

Mayor Bohle performed the third reading of Ordinance No. 475 pertaining to water rates. Bouska made the motion to approve the third reading. Carman seconded and it passed all ayes. McCarville made the motion to approve Ordinance No. 475 pertaining to water rates. Bouska seconded and it passed all ayes.

Mayor Bohle performed the third reading of Ordinance No. 476 pertaining to sewer service charges. Bouska made the motion to approve the third reading. Carman seconded and it passed all ayes. Brenno made the motion to approve Ordinance No. 476 pertaining to sewer service charges. Bouska seconded and it passed all ayes.

Bouska made the motion to approve a resolution approving a wage and benefit agreement for full-time nonunion employees. Fortune seconded and it passed all ayes.

Carman made the motion to approve a resolution approving wage increase for specified permanent part-time employees. Fortune seconded and it passed all ayes.

Carman made a motion to approve a resolution authorizing the Public Works Director to increase the credit limit to \$10,000 for the credit card. Bouska seconded and it passed all ayes.

Bouska made the motion to suspend the Retail Cigarette/Tobacco Permit for The Pub for 30 days beginning June 10, 2019 through July 9, 2019. Fortune seconded and it passed all ayes.

Carman made the motion to close City Hall on June 28, 2019 for end of year processing. Brenno seconded and it passed all ayes.

Daren Sikkink, Engineer from WHKS, made recommendations on where crosswalks with ADA compliant pedestrian ramps should be placed and which crosswalks should be removed. They also submitted estimated costs per item. Girolamo prepared mini-projects with total costs per project if only portions were done at one time. Unfortunately, each project runs into the next one so the most logical option is to do all of the crosswalks/ped ramps/curb & gutters on North Elm Street from the corner of North Park Place to South Park Place at one time. The proposed project will remove four crosswalks and install two new crosswalks across N. Elm. The three crosswalks going north and south across S Plark Place, N Park Place and 2nd Ave W would be replaced. All ped ramps would be ADA compliant and curb and gutters replaced. We will need a few adjoining property owners to agree to replace their sidewalks after crosswalks are removed. The Howard County courthouse sidewalk will be impacted the most so the City Clerk was instructed to attend a Supervisor's meeting to ask for a commitment to work with the City on this project. If the County is agreeable, adjacent property owners will be contacted for cooperation on the project as well. The estimated cost for the City's portion will be about \$100,000. Bouska made the motion to proceed with the crosswalks/ped ramps/curb & gutters on North Elm Street from North Park Place to South Park Place if the County upgrades their sidewalk. McCarville seconded and it passed all ayes.

Mayor asked for comments from the audience. Library Director Kay reported the summer
reading program will be on Wednesdays in June so there will be a lot of activity around the
Library on those days. Steve McCarville reported the new marquee in Beadle Park is now
working and thanked Alum-Line and Bob's Electric for their labor donations to help with the
project. This project was paid by donations received from the Howard County Business &
Tourism auction.

Carman moved to adjourn at 8:21 pm. Fortune seconded and it passed all ayes. The next regular Cresco City Council meeting will be June 17, 2019 at 7:00 pm at Cresco City Hall.

ORDINANCE 478

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF CRESCO, IOWA, BY ADDING A NEW CHAPTER PERTAINING TO URBAN CHICKENS

BE IT ENACTED by the City Council of the City of Cresco, Iowa, as follows:

SECTION 1. NEW CHAPTER. The Code of Ordinances of the City of Cresco, Iowa, is amended by adding a new Chapter 57, entitled URBAN CHICKENS, which is hereby adopted to read as follows:

CHAPTER 57 URBAN CHICKENS

- 57.01 Purpose
- 57.02 Definitions
- 57.03 Where Permitted
- 57.04 Enclosure Requirements
- 57.05 Number of Chickens Permitted
- 57.06 Permit Requirements
- **57.01 PURPOSE.** The purpose of this chapter is to protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens within the City by allowing a process by which a property owner may keep a limited number of domesticated chickens on their property while observing minimum property standards.

57.02 DEFINITIONS. For use in this Chapter the following terms are defined:

- 1. "Chicken" means a member of the subspecies Gallus gallus domesticus, a domesticated fowl.
- 2. "Urban Chicken" means a chicken kept on a permitted tract of land pursuant to a permit issued under this Chapter.
- 3. "Coop" means a cage enclosure or building used for housing and protecting chickens from weather and predators.
- 4. "Pen" means an enclosure for chickens which allows freedom of movement but also prevents escape.
- 5. "Permittee" means an applicant who has been granted a permit to raise, harbor or keep chickens pursuant to this Chapter.
- 57.03 WHERE PERMITTED. Not withstanding the provisions of this section, the keeping of domestic chickens (sub species gallus gallus domesticus), except roosters, shall be permitted in single family residential properties lying within residential zoning districts as shown on the City of Cresco official Zoning Map so long as such keeping is in compliance with this subsection and all other applicable City ordinances.

57.04 ENCLOSURE REQUIREMENTS. The following criteria shall be considered a minimum form of compliance for the City to consider issuing a permit allowing for the presence of any particular chickens unless allowing such chickens would endanger the health, safety, peace, quiet, comfort, enjoyment of, or otherwise become a public nuisance to nearby residents or occupants or places of business:

- A. Chickens must be confined in a coop, fowl house, or mobile coop, known as a chicken tractor, not less than 18 inches in height. In addition to be confined within a coop, a fenced pen area at a size outlined below shall be maintained. Chickens must be kept within the coop, the fowl house, or the fenced pen area at all times unless removed for a temporary time for the safety of the chicken.
- B. The coop, the fowl house, or the fenced pen area must be of such a design to be reasonably expected to prevent entry by dogs, cats, or other animals and shall be completely enclosed.
- C. The coop or fowl house must be used for chickens only and must be well ventilated.
- D. The coop, the fowl house, or the fenced pen area shall have a minimum of four (4) square feet of floor area for each chicken but shall not be any larger than twelve (12) square feet of area for each chicken.
- E. The coop, fowl house, or the fenced pen area shall be a minimum of twenty-five (25) feet from any neighboring dwelling property line at all times. In the event a zoning or other ordinance requires a greater distance, the more restrictive regulations shall apply.
- F. Any coop, fowl house, or fenced pen area must be well drained so there is no accumulation of moisture.
- G. Any coop, fowl house, or the fenced pen area shall be kept clean, sanitary and free from accumulation of chicken excrement and objectionable odors. All droppings and body excretions shall be either placed in fly-proof containers and double-bagged in plastic bags or, in the alternative, used as fertilizer on the same property or, with the owner's permission, on other property within the City, so long as the droppings and body excretions are spread and incorporated into the soil within twenty four (24) hours.
- H. In addition to the coop, fowl house, or fenced pen area, the permittee shall be responsible for sufficiently confining chickens to the permitted property and prevent chickens from entering upon any adjacent property. Loose chickens may not be returned if City personnel are required to capture them.
- I. All chicken feed shall be stored in rodent-proof containers.
- J. All such chickens shall be hens; no roosters are permitted.

- K. The City shall not be liable for injury or death of chickens caused by dogs, cats, or other animals, domestic or wild, whether such animals are licensed by the City or not. Further, injury or death of a chicken caused by an animal is not, in and of itself, sufficient grounds for the City to determine that the animal is a vicious animal pursuant to this Code of Ordinances.
- L. Any dead chicken shall be disposed of immediately upon discovering said chicken in a manner so as to not cause a nuisance pursuant to this Code of Ordinances.
- M. Slaughtering of chickens or selling of eggs is forbidden.
- N. An owner or possessor of animals on property that is newly annexed or rezoned to a residential classification has ninety (90) days from the date of annexation or rezoning to bring the property into compliance required by this section.
- O. A violation of this subsection is a municipal infraction as provided in the Code of Ordinances.
- 57.05 NUMBER OF CHICKENS PERMITTED. No more than six (6) chickens shall be kept or maintained per property at any time. Roosters are not allowed.
- 57.06 PERMIT REQUIREMENTS. No person shall keep any chickens unless they possess a City of Cresco permit issued by the City Public Works Director or their designee. A fine of two hundred fifty (\$250) dollars will be imposed for having chickens without a valid permit.
 - A. Fee. The fee for such permit shall be ten (\$10) dollars.
 - B. Permits will be granted for one (1) year valid from January 1st through December 31st and shall not be pro-rated for partial year.
 - C. Permits may be purchased at any time during the year but will be valid only through December 31st.
 - D. Property owner shall notify the City upon discontinuance of housing chickens.
 - a. As part of discontinuing of housing chickens on the property, the pen and coop areas shall be cleaned in a timely manner so as to not provide a nuisance to neighboring property owners.
 - b. Fees shall not be refunded if the property owner removes the chickens from the premises.
 - E. The permit may be suspended or revoked by the Public Works Director, or their designee, upon hearing and finding evidence that the permittee has violated the conditions of the permit listed in this Section of the Code.

- a. All chickens must be removed from the premises and disposed of in accordance with public health practices upon revocation of the permit.
- b. There will be no refund of the permit fee.
- c. All associated costs of removal of the chickens shall be assessed back to the property owner.
- F. By the granting of the permit to raise chickens and the application thereof, the permittee authorizes that the City or its agents have the right to go onto permittee's property any time for the limited purpose of inspection of the premises to ensure that all applicable conditions have been met.

SECTION 2. REPEALER. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 4. WHEN EFFECTIVE. This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

ORDINANCE 478 SUMMARY

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF CRESCO, IOWA, BY ADDING A NEW CHAPTER PERTAINING TO URBAN CHICKENS

Below is a summary of ORDINANCE 478, a full copy of said ordinance may be obtained at City Hall 130 N Park Place Cresco, IA 52136

CHAPTER 57 URBAN CHICKENS

No more than six (6) chickens shall be kept or maintained per property at any time. Roosters are not allowed. An annual application and permit fee of \$10 is required. A fine will be imposed of \$250 for keeping chickens without a valid permit. Random inspections will be conducted to ensure applicable conditions have been met.

Chickens must be confined in a coop, fowl house, or mobile coop not less than 18 inches in height. An area of 4 to 12 square feet per chicken is required and must be a minimum of 25 feet from any property line. It must be completely enclosed and designed to prevent entry of predators. It must be well ventilated and drained and kept clean and sanitary. Slaughtering of chickens or selling of eggs is forbidden.

SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

WHEN EFFECTIVE. The foregoing Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of passage and publication of this ordinance as provided by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 477

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF CRESCO, IOWA, BY AMENDING PROVISIONS PERTAINING TO LIVESTOCK

BE IT ENACTED by the City Council of the City of Cresco, Iowa, as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 55, Section 05, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Cresco, Iowa, is repealed and the following adopted in lieu thereof:

55.05 LIVESTOCK. It is unlawful for a person to keep livestock except chickens within the corporate limits of the City except in an area zoned for this purpose. Chickens are allowed by permit only and according to regulations in Chapter 57 of the Code of Ordinances. No roosters are allowed within corporate limits of the City.

SECTION 2. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 3. WHEN EFFECTIVE. This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

28E County/City Project Agreement - Project No. LFM-(Vernon Rd)--7X-45

WHEREAS, both Howard County and the City of Cresco are a public agency as is defined by Section 28E.2 of the Code of Iowa, and

WHEREAS, Section 28E.3 of the Code of Iowa provides that any power or powers, privileges or authority exercised or capable of exercise by a public agency of the State of Iowa may be exercised and enjoyed jointly by a public agency of the State of Iowa having such power or powers, and

WHEREAS, it is deemed to be in the best interest of Howard County, the City of Cresco, and their respective citizens, that the County and City jointly undertake to provide a construction project within the Corporate Limits of the City of Cresco.

WHEREAS, it is proposed, that Howard County plan, design and let for bidding, the reconstruction of Vernon Road from the Corporate Limits of the City of Cresco, Northeast to a point determined by the City of Cresco.

WHEREAS, the Howard County Board of Supervisors and the Cresco City Council have informed themselves as to the proposed improvement.

IT IS NOW AGREED that Howard County and the City of Cresco enter into an agreement pursuant to Chapter 28E of the Code of Iowa providing for cooperative action pursuant to the proposed roadway construction project and, said cooperative actions include the following:

- 1. SCOPE OF WORK Howard County will design, let and construct improvements to Vernon Road.
- DURATION This agreement shall commence on the date that both parties sign this agreement and shall continue thereafter until the final completion of the project and settlement of the financial conditions of this agreement.
- PURPOSE The purpose of this agreement is to accomplish the proposed project as described herein in accordance with the aforesaid scope of work and in agreement with conditions specified in this agreement.
- 4. FINANCING Howard County shall initially finance the cost of the project. The City of Cresco shall reimburse Howard County for the actual cost of construction above and beyond the Howard County cost of construction. Reimbursement shall be paid over a period not to exceed six months from the date of final project acceptance by the Howard County Engineer.

- 5. ADMINISTRATION All engineering services provided before, during and after construction shall be administered by Howard County through its Secondary Roads Department, which shall be responsible for all procedural and substantive matters relating thereto. These services shall be provided by the Howard County Engineer or his authorized representative and shall be in accordance with appropriate standards of the Iowa Department of Transportation. The Howard County Engineer shall determine when, in his judgment, performance is complete and shall thereafter recommend to the County and City that the project be finally accepted.
- 6. The County and City agree to save and indemnify and keep harmless, each other against all liabilities, judgments, costs, and expenses which may in any way come against either party or which in any way result from carelessness or neglect of either party or its agents, employees, or workmen in any respect whatsoever.
- 7. The County and City agree to indemnify and hold each other, their employees and agents, wholly harmless from any damages, claims, demands, or suits by any person or persons arising out of any acts or omissions by either party, its agents, servants or employees in the course of any work done in connection with any of the matters set forth in this agreement.

8. TERMINATION: -

- a. This agreement shall be considered binding upon both Howard County and the City of Cresco and shall not be terminated until provisions of paragraph 8b are met after actual work has begun on the project.
- b. This agreement will be terminated upon final acceptance of the work and final settlement of the financial conditions set forth in paragraph 4 thereof.
