Mayor Bohle called the Cresco City Council meeting to order on April 15, 2019, at 7:00 pm at City Hall. Council Members Brenno, McCarville, Fortune, Bouska and Carman were present. No council members were absent.

Bouska made the motion to approve the consent agenda which included approval of the: agenda; claims; minutes of the April 1, 2019 meeting; application for tax abatement under the Urban Revitalization Plan for Mark & Danna Kubik; Class C Beer Permit (BC) and Class B Wine Permit with Sunday sales to JAGDAMBE, LLC d/b/a Cresco Mart; special Class C Liquor License (BW) (beer/wine) with Sunday sales and outdoor service to Atomic Pizza, LLC d/b/a Atomic Pizza Pub. Carman seconded and it passed all ayes.

Public Works Director Freidhof reported: (a) busy sweeping streets and started the yard waste pickup route today; (b) we are receiving a \$2,500 matching grant for boulevard trees from Alliant Energy. We ordered 55 trees for a cost of about \$5,000; (c) 2nd Street East project weathered the winter well as the Proof Roll today shows it is firm. They will start pouring concrete tomorrow and hope to have it finished about mid-May; (d) tomorrow we will start demolishing the trailers we have titles for. Two trailers will be moved by the owners so the only one left will be Barbara Boyd's.

Police Chief Ruroden reported that March was busy with traffic and ice and snow. Last week Cresco Police Officers, Iowa State Patrol, Cresco Fire Department, and the Ambulance Service performed a mock crash at the high school. It was very educational and a good reminder of the risks of drinking and driving before prom. The staff and students gave a lot of positive feedback. A guest speaker from Davenport did a phenomenal job talking to the students.

City Clerk Girolamo reported: (a) the County Assessor updated the tax abatement values so we are sending out letters to the eligible residents. We have eleven new tax abatements for next year. Currently we have 33 active tax abatements with eight expiring after this year; (b) evaluating water and sewer rates to determine the rate increase needed for next year; (c) with only two months left in this fiscal year, we are evaluating projects that haven't been finished yet and will discuss with Department Heads to get them done; (d) one final amendment may be needed before yearend; (e) looking at creating a new trust fund for trees as businesses have come forward to sponsor and pay for treating ash trees in Beadle Park. A separate fund will enable us to track the revenue and expenses as treatment occurs over a ten year period; (f) applying for three grants to help pay for the demolition of the nuisance properties.

McCarville reported the Airport Commission met and discussed the land rental agreement and next year's budget. They will contact Kirkham Michel regarding new hangars and what we can put up and what we can do ourselves to save money. They also reviewed their five year plan.

Library Director Kay reported they had Bob Tupy come in to repair concrete issues to alleviate problems with water getting into the building. They are looking at how to paint or repair the walls in the children's amphitheater. The Genealogical Society has digitized old copies of the newspaper and are working on search engines and how to link them to the Library's website.

The Park Board met and reported businesses around Beadle Park have committed to sponsoring treatment of eight ash trees over a ten year period. Kris Riley reported a group is looking at adding on to the Fitness Center to install a splash pad and Lazy River (rehabilitation pool) which Scott Thomson is interested in funding a large portion of the project. An informational meeting will be held May 21st at NICC conference room at 5:30 pm for interested patrons, Council and Park Board. Scott Thomson has also offered to pay for resurfacing the pool and spa.

Mark Kubik and Roy Gorter addressed the Council regarding their desire to replace their sidewalk downtown. Phil Henry will also probably replace his sidewalk at the same time. The

curb and gutter are in poor shape and they were wondering if the City Council would work with them and replace the crosswalks and curb and gutter at the same time. Council was concerned with the cost to the City due to requirements to meet ADA requirements. The estimated cost to the City was about \$300,000 in 2017 to replace crosswalks and ADA compliance downtown. Council will look at eliminating some of the crosswalks and do the project in stages. Roy suggested assessing the project to the business owners. Council will look at the sidewalks and curbs and discuss the issue again at the May 6th meeting. Bouska mentioned that residential sidewalks were also in poor condition and should also be addressed.

Richard Farmer asked the Council to consider changing the Cresco Ordinance to allow laying hens within the city limits. The Council will look at other cities' ordinances and consider changing it with a permit required. No roosters will be allowed.

Barbara Boyd's application for a grant to move her double-wide trailer was denied. She is now requesting the Council to help. Council asked Rod and Jason Passmore to get a quote for moving it and looking at options.

Bouska made the motion to waive the Demolition Permit fee for City of Cresco property located at 321 4th Ave SW. Fortune seconded and it passed all ayes.

McCarville made the motion to waive the Demolition Permit fee for City of Cresco property located at 218 5th Ave East. Brenno seconded and it passed all ayes.

Brenno made the motion to write off the utility bill of \$426.58 per Purchase Agreement for property located at 218 5th Ave East. Bouska seconded and it passed all ayes.

Council discussed whether to do a Development Agreement or have a sale of property located at 218 5th Ave East. A public hearing will be scheduled so if there are any other interested parties for building a house on this property this would give them a chance to submit their proposals to Council. Bouska made the motion to proceed with a Development Agreement with Wemark unless other proposals are presented at the public hearing. Fortune seconded and it passed all ayes.

Fortune made the motion to discontinue the credit for running water for frozen service lines after the April 30, 2019 utility bills. Bouska seconded and it passed all ayes.

McCarville made the motion to set the Public Hearing for Ordinance No. 475 pertaining to water rates for May 6, 2019. Brenno seconded and it passed all ayes.

Bouska made the motion to set the Public Hearing for Ordinance No. 476 pertaining to sewer service charges for May 6, 2019. Fortune seconded and it passed all ayes.

Council discussed whether to pay for a city-wide cleanup this year or to discontinue doing this due to problems in the past and the rising costs to the City and the residents. Hawkeye Sanitation will pick up big items by scheduling it and paying for the service by individual residents. McCarville made the motion to schedule a Toxic Waste disposal after July 1, 2019. Bouska seconded and passed all ayes.

Mayor asked for comments from the audience. Brad Burke invited the City Council and the public to a Chamber ribbon cutting for the FIT Running Club at Burke Auction Service building on April 24, 2019 at 5:30 pm. They will also present donation checks from the Brew & Stew to the Cresco Fire Fighters and the Howard County EMS. A social run/walk will follow at 6 pm. They will have weekly group runs/walks Sunday afternoons at 1 pm.

Jason Passmore thanked everyone who attended the Howard County Business & Tourism banquet. Dan Gable presented an entertaining speech. The new Beadle Park marquee will be installed when the weather gets nice. They have been working with the statues in town. A request from John & Nancy Schmauss was received to install one in the boulevard in front of Cresco Bank & Trust they are donating in memory of Todd Schmauss next to the tree planted in his recognition. Council was in favor of allowing it but noted some statues need some work on the

bases. Kiwanis Club has been maintaining them the past year. Dale and Mary Ellen Turnmire started them more than 15 years ago and maintained them. Jason suggested the Council come up with a Request for Proposal (RFP) for the trailer park. Everyone agreed to let the developers propose plans for development of the property for multi-residential housing. A work session was scheduled for April 24, 2019 at 6 pm to draft the RFP or at least come up with a timeline.

The property owner was not present so the Council did not go into closed session pursuant to Iowa Code 21.5 (j) to discuss potential purchase of real estate.

Carman moved to adjourn at 8:15 pm. Bouska seconded and it passed all ayes. The next regular Cresco City Council meeting will be May 6, 2019 at 7:00 pm at Cresco City Hall.

Mayor Bohle called the Cresco City Council work session to order on April 24, 2019, at 6:00 pm at City Hall. Council Members Brenno, McCarville, Fortune, Bouska and Carman were present. No council members were absent. Also in attendance were Public Works Director Rod Freidhof, City Clerk Michelle Girolamo, Jason Passmore and Aaron Wemark,

Girolamo presented workpapers supporting the recommendation to increase water rates by 4% and sewer rates by 5% to reach budgeted revenue for fiscal year 2019/2020. This will increase the minimum bill by 92 cents per month. A public hearing and the first reading of the ordinance will be held at the regular council meeting on May 6, 2019.

Various nuisance properties were discussed and letters either have already been sent or will be sent. Barbara Boyd requested another extension for her eviction notice until May 30, 2019. The extension was approved but collection procedures will be started for the past due lot rent.

Council discussed items that should be included in the Request for Proposal (RFP) for housing development of the City-owned trailer park property. It will be kept as general as possible to allow developers to submit proposals of all different possibilities. The property will be sold for \$1 but will not be eligible for any property tax abatement programs. The rezoning to an R3 zone will allow multi-residential housing units to be constructed. Criteria was discussed and will be sent to Ahlers & Cooney to prepare the RFP. Council will review the drafted RFP before proceeding to publishing the RFP and holding public hearings. To replenish the Nuisance House Fund, Council agreed to allocate the first five years of property tax revenue from the developed property to this Fund.

Council inspected the sidewalks, crosswalks, curb and gutters from Leuthold's to O'Henry's. Mark Kubik and Roy Gorter attended the previous Council meeting to report they were planning to replace their sidewalks along with Phil Henry. They asked the Council if they would replace the abutting curb & gutter and possibly crosswalks. Council's concern is the high cost of making the crosswalk approaches ADA compatible and the City has not budgeted for any of these expenses. Estimated costs will be compiled for the May 6, 2019 Council meeting with different options including eliminating some of the crosswalks.

Bouska made the motion to adjourn at 7:52 pm. Carman seconded and it passed all ayes. The next regular Cresco City Council meeting will be May 6, 2019 at 7:00 pm at Cresco City Hall.

 - C. All over 67,000 gallons used per month @ \$4.20 per 1000 gallons.

SECTION 2. Chapter 92, Section 03, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Cresco, Iowa, is repealed and the following adopted in lieu thereof:

CHAPTER 72 URBAN CHICKENS

Sections:

- 72.1 Purpose.
- 72.2 Definitions.
- 72.3 Where Permitted.
- 72.4 Enclosure Requirements.

Sec. 72.1 Purpose. The purpose of this chapter is to protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens within the City by allowing a process by which a property owner may keep a limited number of domesticated chickens on their property while observing minimum property standards.

Sec. 72.2 Definitions. Definitions used in this chapter.

Chicken shall mean a member of the subspecies Gallus gallus domesticus, a domesticated fowl.

Urban chicken shall mean a chicken kept on a permitted tract of land pursuant to a permit issued under this Chapter.

Coop shall mean a cage, enclosure or building used for housing and protecting chickens from weather and predators.

Pen shall mean an enclosure for chickens which allows freedom of movement but also prevents escape.

Permittee shall mean an applicant who has been granted a permit to raise, harbor or keep chickens pursuant to this Chapter.

Sec. 72.3 Where Permitted. Notwithstanding the provisions of this section, the keeping of domestic chickens (sub species gallus gallus domesticus), except roosters, shall be permitted in single family residential properties lying within residential zoning districts as shown on the City of Waverly official Zoning Map so long as such keeping is in compliance with this subsection and all other applicable City ordinances.

Sec. 72.4 Enclosure Requirements. The following criteria shall be considered a minium form of compliance for the City to consider issuing a permit allowing for the presence of any particular chickens unless allowing such chickens would endanger the health, safety, peace, quiet, comfort, enjoyment of, or otherwise become a public nuisance to nearby residents or occupants or places of business:

- 1. Chickens must be confined in a coop, fowl house, or mobile coop, known as a chicken tractor, not less than 18 inches in height. In addition to be confined within a coop, a fenced pen area at a size outlined below shall be maintained. Chickens must be kept within the coop, the fowl house, or the fenced pen area at all times unless removed for a temporary time for the safety of the chicken.
- 2. The coop, the fowl house, or the fenced pen area must be of such a design to be reasonably expected to prevent entry by dogs, cats, or other animals and shall be completely enclosed.
- The coop or fowl house must be used for chickens only and must be well ventilated.
- 4. The coop, the fowl house, or the fenced pen area shall have a minimum of four (4) square feet of floor area for each chicken but shall not be any larger than twelve (12) square feet of area for each chicken. The coop, fowl house, or fenced pen area shall be a minimum of twenty-five (25) feet from any neighboring dwelling property line. Chicken tractors shall be a minimum of ten (46) twenty-five (25) feet from any property line at all times. In the event a zoning or other ordinance requires a greater distance, the more restrictive regulations shall apply.
- 5. Any coop, fowl house, or fenced pen area must be well drained so there is no accumulation of moisture.
- 6. Any coop, fowl house, or fenced pen area shall be kept clean, sanitary and free from accumulation of chicken excrement and objectionable odors. All droppings and body excretions shall be either placed in fly-proof containers and double-bagged in plastic bags or, in the alternative, used as fertilizer on the same property or, with the owner's permission, on other property within the City, so long as the droppings and body excretions are spread and incorporated into the soil within twenty four (24) hours.
- 7. In addition to the coop, fowl house, or fenced pen area, the permittee shall be responsible for sufficiently confining chickens to the permitted property and prevent chickens from entering upon any adjacent property.
 - 8. All chicken feed shall be stored in rodent-proof containers.
 - 9. All such chickens must be hens; no roosters are permitted.
- 10. The City shall not be liable for injury or death of chickens caused by dogs, cats, or other animals, domestic or wild, whether such animals are licensed by the City or not. Further, injury or death of a chicken caused by an animal is not, in and of itself, sufficient grounds for the City to determine that the animal is a vicious animal pursuant to this Code of Ordinances. Any dead chicken shall be disposed of immediately upon discovering said dead chicken in a manner so as to not cause a nuisance pursuant to this Code of Ordinances.
- 11. Slaughtering of chickens or selling of eggs are forbidden
- 12. An owner or possessor of animals on property that is newly annexed or rezoned to a residential classification has ninety (90) days from the date of annexation or rezoning to bring the property into compliance required by this section.
- 13. A violation of this subsection is a municipal infraction as provided in this Code of Ordinances.

Sec. 72.5 Number of Chickens Permitted.

1. No more than four (4) chickens shall be kept or maintained per property at any time.

Sec. 72.6 Permit Requirements. No person shall keep any chickens unless they possess a City of Waverly permit issued by the City Administrator or their designee.

- 1. Fee. The fee for such permit shall be twenty-five \$25 thirty (\$30) dollars.
- 2. Permits will be granted for one-(4) three (3) years valid from January 1 through until December 31 and shall not be pro-rated for partial year three years from the application year.

Permits may be purchased at any time during the year but will be valid only through December 31.

Property owner shall notify the City upon discontinuance of housing chickens.

- As part of discontinuing of housing chickens on the property, the pen and coop areas shall be cleaned in a timely manner so as to not provide a nuisance to neighboring property owners.
 - Fees shall not be refunded if the property owner removes the chickens from the premises.
- bid. The permit may be suspended or revoked by the City Administrator or their designee upon hearing and finding evidence that the permittee has violated the conditions of the permit and listed in this Section of the Code. All chickens must be removed from the premises and disposed of in accordance with public health practices upon revocation of the permit. There will be no refund of the permit fee. All associated costs of removal of the chickens shall be assessed back to the property owner.
- e.e. By the granting of the permit to raise chickens and the application thereof, the permittee authorizes that the City or its agents have the right to go onto permittee's property any time for the limited purpose of inspection of the premises to ensure that all applicable conditions have been met.
