Mayor Fortune called the Cresco City Council meeting to order on May 20, 2024 at 5:30 pm. Council Members Carman, Fosaaen, Bouska, McConnell, and Kriener were present. No council members were absent.

Carman made the motion to approve the consent agenda which included approval of the: agenda; claims; minutes from the May 6, 2024 meeting; minutes from May 6, 2024 special meeting; retail cigarette/tobacco permit for Howard County Jail; Special Class C Retail Alcohol License (BW) with outdoor service to Atomic Pizza Pub, LLC dba Atomic Pizza Pub to expand outdoor service area for music event on May 30, 2024; Special Class C Retail Alcohol License (BW) with outdoor service to Atomic Pizza Pub LLC d/b/a Atomic Pizza Pub. Bouska seconded and it passed all ayes.

Public Works Director Brenno reported: (a) Street department has been busy painting crosswalks; (b) CIT has finished the cleaning of the sewer mains in the northeast section of town; (c) the main concrete for the roadway has been poured on the 7th Street West Project. It will not be open by Memorial Day due to weather; (d) will be attending a nuisance conference Thursday. Currently working on about 30 different nuisances.

Police Chief Ruroden had nothing to report for the police department.

City Clerk Hill reported: (a) Iowa League of Cities annual conference is September 18-20 in Sioux City; (b) Rural Housing Readiness Action Plan is available to review; (c) Northeast Iowa Business Network is hosting a regional roundup on July 17th at PIVO Brewery with featured speakers from IEDA; (d) met with architects on the back portion of the Fitness Center to explore options; (e) reminders have been sent out for the lead service line inventory that is required by the DNR. All properties will need to fill it out and return them as soon as possible; (f) last spring yardwaste pickup is May 28th and will resume in the fall; (g) raffle tickets for K-9 EmmyLou will be sold until the end of May. Tickets are \$20 and can be purchased at City Hall or from the police officers.

McConnell attended the Chamber meeting where the conversation revolved around housing and the potential Alliant rate increase.

McConnell reported on the Park Board meeting and they are looking at options for the train in Beadle Park.

Mayor Fortune asked for comments from the audience and there were none.

Andy Ludeking requested to purchase a small section of land adjoining his property. This area is a storm retention basin and Council would like more information before deciding. Brenno will reach out to WHKS to get information on the basin and Council will need to determine if there is no public purpose for keeping the property if willing to sell that portion.

Bouska made a motion to set a Public Hearing for June 3, 2024 for budget amendment #4 for fiscal year ending June 30, 2024. McConnell seconded and it passed all ayes.

McConnell made the motion to set the Public Hearing to amend Chapter 92 Sections 02, 03, 05, and 06, Chapter 99 Section 02, and Chapter 106 section 08 (2) the City of Cresco Code of Ordinances pertaining to water rates, sewer service charges, and yardwaste fees for June 3, 2024. Kriener seconded and it passed all ayes.

Mayor Fortune performed the first reading of the summary of proposed Ordinance No. 509 amending Chapter 92 Sections 02, 03, 05, and 06, Chapter 99 Section 02, and Chapter 106 section 08 (2) the City of Cresco Code of Ordinances pertaining to water rates, sewer service charges, and yardwaste fees of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Cresco, Iowa. Bouska made the motion to approve the first reading. Carman seconded and it passed all ayes.

Mayor Fortune performed the first reading of the summary of proposed Ordinance No. 511 amending Chapter 155 in the City of Cresco Code of Ordinances Pertaining to Weeds of the

Code of Ordinances of the City of Cresco, Iowa. Carman made the motion to approve the first reading. Kriener seconded and it passed all ayes.

The resolution second and third reading of Ordinance number 511 tabled until the June 3 meeting.

Hill explained that the dealer is interested in doing a trade-in towards a new wing for snow removal, but won't have more information until the June 3rd meeting.

A request was received to place information on the town churches in the new customer packet. Kriener made the motion to include the information on the parishes in the packet. McConnell seconded and Kriener, McConnell, Carman, and Fosaaen voted aye. Bouska voted nay. The motion passed by majority vote.

Bouska made the motion to approve the resolution authorizing the City Clerk to sign the Offer of Employment for the part-time city hall position with Michelle Elton. Fosaaen seconded and Kriener, Bouska, Carman, and Fosaaen voted aye. McConnell voted nay. The motion passed by majority vote.

Council discussed dates that consumer fireworks should be allowed. Council was in favor of allowing them during the weekend after the July 4th. Display fireworks require a permit approved by the Fire Chief and Council and shall be handled by a competent operator as defined in City Code. Kriener made the motion to allow consumer fireworks for July 3 – July 6. Fosaaen seconded and it passed all ayes.

Carman moved to adjourn the Council Meeting at 6:07 pm. Kriener seconded and it passed all ayes. The next regular Cresco City Council meeting will be June 3, 2024, at 5:30 pm at Cresco City Hall.







CHAPTER 66

LOAD AND WEIGHT RESTRICTIONS

66.01 Temporary Embargo 66.02 Permits for Excess Size and Weight 66.03 Load Limits Upon Certain Streets

66.04 Load Limits on Bridges 66.05 Truck Route

66.01 TEMPORARY EMBARGO. If the Council declares an embargo when it appears by reason of deterioration, rain, snow or other climatic conditions that certain streets will be seriously damaged or destroyed by vehicles weighing in excess of an amount specified by the signs, no such vehicles shall be operated on streets so designated by such signs erected in accordance with Chapter 61 of this Traffic Code.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 321,471 & 472)

66.02 PERMITS FOR EXCESS SIZE AND WEIGHT. The Council may, upon application and good cause being shown therefor, issue a special permit in writing authorizing the applicant to operate or move a vehicle or combination of vehicles of a size or weight or load exceeding the maximum specified by State law or the City over those streets or bridges named in the permit which are under the jurisdiction of the City and for which the City is responsible for maintenance.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 321.473 & 321E.1)

66.03 LOAD LIMITS UPON CERTAIN STREETS. When signs are erected giving notice thereof, no person shall operate any vehicle with a gross weight in excess of the amounts specified on such signs at any time upon any of the streets or parts of streets for which said signs are erected in accordance with Chapter 61 of this Traffic Code.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 321.473 & 475)

66.04 LOAD LIMITS ON BRIDGES. Where it has been determined that any City bridge has a capacity less than the maximum permitted on the streets of the City, or on the street serving the bridge, the Council may cause to be posted and maintained signs, in accordance with Chapter 61 of this Traffic Code, on said bridge and at suitable distances ahead of the entrances thereof to warn drivers of such maximum load limits, and no person shall drive a vehicle weighing, loaded or unloaded, upon said bridge in excess of such posted limit.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 321.471)

- 66.05 TRUCK ROUTE. When truck routes have been designated in accordance with Chapter 61, any motor vehicle exceeding established weight limits shall comply with the following:
 - 1. Use of Established Routes. Every such motor vehicle having no fixed terminal within the City or making no scheduled or definite stops within the City for the purpose of loading or unloading shall travel over or upon those streets within the City designated as truck routes and none other.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 321.473)

2. Deliveries Off Truck Route. Any such motor vehicle, when loaded or empty, having a fixed terminal, making a scheduled or definite stop within the City for the purpose of loading or unloading shall proceed over or upon the designated routes to

the nearest point of its scheduled or definite stop and shall proceed thereto, load or unload and return, by the most direct route to its point of departure from said designated route.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 321.473)

3. Employer's Responsibility. The owner, or any other person, employing or otherwise directing the driver of any vehicle shall not require or knowingly permit the operation of such vehicle upon a street in any manner contrary to this section.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 321.473)

- 61.01 TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES. The Council shall establish by resolution, and cause to be placed and maintained, appropriate traffic control devices to indicate parking spaces and zones, no parking zones, limited parking zones, reserved parking zones, loading zones, safety zones, school zones, hospital zones, quiet zones, traffic zones other than the above, truck routes, school stops, stop intersections, yield right-of-way intersections, one-way streets, streets to be laned for traffic and play streets. The Council shall also have the power to designate and indicate by resolution intersections at which traffic shall be controlled by traffic signals; intersections at which left turns, right turns and U-turns shall be prohibited; and intersections at which markers, buttons or other indications shall be placed to indicate the course to be traveled by vehicles traversing or turning at such intersections.
- 61.02 INSTALLATION. The Council shall cause to be placed and maintained traffic control devices to carry out the provisions of the Traffic Code of the City under State law or to regulate, guide or warn traffic. The City shall keep a record of all such traffic control devices.

 (Code of Iowa, Sec. 321.254 & 321.255)
- 61.03 COMPLIANCE. No driver of a vehicle shall disobey the instructions of any official traffic control device placed in accordance with the provisions of this chapter, unless at the time otherwise directed by a peace officer, subject to the exceptions granted the driver of an authorized emergency vehicle under Section 321.231 of the *Code of Iowa*.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 321.256)

61.04 CROSSWALKS. The Council is hereby authorized to designate and maintain crosswalks by appropriate traffic control devices at intersections where, due to traffic conditions, there is particular danger to pedestrians crossing the street or road-way, and at such other places as traffic conditions require.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 372.13[4] & 321.255)

61.05 TRAFFIC LANES. Where traffic lanes have been marked on street pavements at such places as traffic conditions require, it is unlawful for the operator of any vehicle to fail or refuse to keep such vehicle within the boundaries of any such lane except when lawfully passing another vehicle or preparatory to making a lawful turning movement.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 372.13[4] & 321.255)

61.06 NECESSITY OF SIGNS. No provision of this Traffic Code for which signs are required shall be enforced against an alleged violator if, at the time and place of the alleged violation, an official sign is not in a viewable position and sufficiently legible to an ordinarily observant person.

61.07 STANDARDS. Traffic control devices shall comply with standards established by The Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 321.255)
